SHARED STREETS UPDATE

Crews are now working on the sidewalk along **Brookhollow**. Before they reach the intersection at **Raven**, they will be laying out the offset bump-outs and reaching out directly to neighbors whose yards are adjacent to those changes.

As always, all neighbors are welcome to reach out with concerns or questions — either to the **Shared Streets team** (Ming-ru.Chu@austintexas.gov) or to the **Neighborhood Association board**. The city has told us they will also conduct a **survey once the project is complete** so we can all provide feedback.

We encourage everyone to keep an **open mind** about these updates. They are designed to make our streets **safer for kids, pets, walkers, and drivers alike**. If any of the changes create safety or functional issues, we will have the chance to raise those concerns together with the city and work toward solutions as a neighborhood. So far, the city has been **very communicative and responsive** throughout this process.

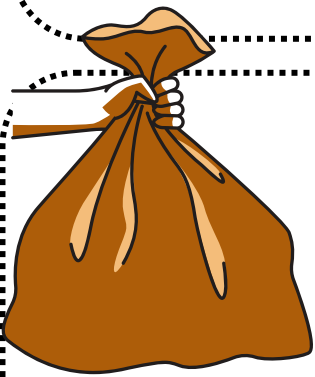

WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION?

In light of some recent situations in our neighborhood, we want to clarify the role of the *Coronado Hills Neighborhood Association*. Our goal is to support the **overall well-being of the neighborhood, advocate for community-wide issues, and connect residents with the right city resources.**

Neighborhood Association (NA)

A voluntary group of residents, property owners, and businesses working together to improve quality of life.

- Membership is voluntary
- No legal authority to enforce maintenance/design rules beyond City/County ordinances



We CAN:

- Advocate for neighborhood-wide issues (ex: a home with safety hazards, illegal dumping, broken streetlights)
- Connect neighbors to City of Austin Code, APD, or other city departments
- Support enforcement of deed restrictions
- Organize community clean-ups, events, or neighborhood watches
- Support traffic calming measures, sidewalks, and park improvements
- Share information and resources

We CANNOT:

- Encroach on individual property choices unless they create a broader safety or code issue that affects the broader neighborhood (ex: lawn clutter, paint color, decorations)
- Resolve personal conflicts that do not impact the broader neighborhood (ex: disagreements about noise, pets, or personalities)
