Walking in Christ: part 2

Lay Leader's Report

The Milton Borough Bicentennial Celebration Service that Bethany hosted and helped conduct on Sunday, February 26 was a great success. Our church seated about 200 people for the event, many of them community and area governance officials and historians. A special treat was that Bethany's once and long-time organist Merle Nicholas joyously and gratefully accepted the honor of playing the church's well-known and greatly-respected instrument during the entire ceremony. On special request by the organizers, he performed (with his characteristic skill and fervor) the exact same music for this celebratory event as he did for the equivalent service during the Borough's Sesquicentennial in 1967.

Ash Wednesday 2017 was observed with a joint Communion service between Bethany and this year's host church, St. Andrew's UMC / Milton. Correlatively, this Lenten season's "Soup and the Word" series got under way on March 8 with Bethany taking the lead for a noon hour of fellowship and a homiletic offering by Pastor Damien, all at the First Presbyterian Church here in town.

Bethany lost one of its dearest friends on February 27 when long-time member A. Barney Price passed into glory. But I can't use the word "lost" as if it were definitive of something. In reality, Barney is, and always will be, with us. He was, is and always will be a significant part of our church – part of its heart, in truth. We can rather say "So long, Barn – thanks for being with us for so long. We'll absolutely see you again." And we and his family, his friends, and his wonderful wife Flora can celebrate his victory, because we know what he has won, how he has won, and what his winning means.

I recently took advantage of another opportunity to support the ministry of the Crossroads of Life Prison Faith Community, a central Illinois United Methodist organization that exists to render Christian services to the populations of the men's and women's state detention facilities located in the area of the town of Lincoln in that state. A newly-instituted effort of theirs focuses on the need for new prison arrivals to be provided with basic toiletries, since they get to the jails without benefit of personal care or hygienic amenities and most times must then work and wait for weeks or even months to establish their commissary accounts before they can acquire anything along those lines. I recently funded the first whole year's worth of kits that will fill that need at Logan Women's Correctional Facility, a prison just south of Peoria, Illinois. The kits have already begun to arrive out there, I'm told, so this is a "mission accomplished" in the face of tight money and a tangle of Illinois state restrictions and regulations about permissible items and their sources.


Friday, April 14th at 6:30 p.m. Good Friday Service [This will be a time of reflection, music, and prayer.]


Trustees' Report.....

The renovations inside the church continue. The old restroom in the Elm Street Lounge/Chapel has been removed and a new handicapped accessible restroom is currently being constructed in its place. The construction of the new restroom will require the kitchenette to be installed on the exterior wall. Because there was some existing water damage on the ceiling and some cracking in the ceiling and walls in the room, the Trustees have decided to have the entire room painted. At our last meeting a representative from Atlantic Equipment Specialists discussed with the Trustees the development of a plan to furnish the kitchen with the appropriate appliances and equipment.

In Parish House news, the first floor has been cleaned out and the renovations have begun. The contractor is currently covering all the walls with new drywall and building a new wall at the bottom of the stairs so the heat and air conditioning does not travel up the stairs. As we've shared, the end result should be a nice office for the Pastor and a separate office for the rest of the staff.

Ad Board Report

The church will soon have its own debit card. This will greatly facilitate the purchases of locally available small items that are needed quickly, as well as items that are best (or, in some cases, only) obtainable on line. The card will operate off its own dedicated church bank account and have spending limit and clearly-defined church personnel signature restrictions.

There promises to be a short period in late June when Bethany's pastoral transition necessitates the engagement of Lay Speakers for two Contemporary services and at least one Traditional. PSPRC is working to assure the seamless continuity of service leadership through that time frame, pending definitive schedule developments.

Pastor Damien has the 2017 Susquehanna Annual Conference and another mandatory Spiritual Retreat coming up in May, but those are weekday events that will not affect his Bethany preaching obligations.

The Board, responding to Sarah Heimbach's request to be relieved of the leadership of the Bethany Prayer circle, has formally named Sharon Foust and Judy Carl as co-coordinators. And in doing so, the whole church membership acknowledges, with many thanks, Sarah's long and highly valued service in that position.
