Village of Cohocton

Local Law Numbered 1 of the year 1999

A Local Law entitled "Establishing Residency Requirements for the Offices of Village Clerk and Village Treasurer"

Be It enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Cohocton as follows:

SECTION 1.0 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION

Section 1.1 Village Law Section 3-300 authorizes the board of trustees of a village with a population of less than three thousand to provide, in lieu of any other residency requirement imposed by law, that the village clerk and village treasurer may reside within the county in which the village is wholly or partially situate.

SECTION 2.0 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR OFFICES OF VILLAGE CLERK AND VILLAGE TREASURER

Section 2.1 No person or persons shall be eligible to hold the offices of village clerk and village treasurer of Cohocton, New York, unless said person or persons shall be a resident of Steuben County, New York.

SECTION 3.0 EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 3.1 This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.
