Greenbush Township Board Meeting

The regular meeting of the Greenbush Township Board was held the 7th of October 2013 at 7:00PM. The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Jim Jorae and the Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the agenda, Julie Havens supported and the motion carried.

Minutes from the September 2013 board meeting were read. Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the minutes with a correction to the amount in the FirstMerit Savings to \$45,363.31, Julie Havens supported and the motion carried.

The Treasurers report was presented. The balances on September 30th, 2013 were:

Bill Dershem made a motion to accept the report as read, supported by Bernadette Hayes and it carried. Bill Dershem made a motion to transfer \$33,176.59 to pay orders 836 thru 850. Bernadette Hayes supported and the motion carried.

Public comment came from Kevin Kirk with an offer to purchase the Silvers Road property, Peter Klein on the web site and the cost of the special election, Jean Bradley on burning leaves, Ron Matson on the web site.

Kam Washburn, County Commissioner, reports the Searles property sale will wrap up by November. Motz Park has a \$10,000 annual budget. The new animal shelter is on schedule and two county commissioners have been appointed to the Non-Motorized Advisory Council and will work on the Rails to Trail project. Property at Scott and M-21 has been rezoned and the Speedway will become a bigger facility.

Eric Thompson, from the Clinton County Sheriff Department stated there was not much change in the number of car-deer accidents, and they are looking for an older, dark green minivan with a stripe on the bottom in connection with some local B & E's. The new deputy's have been trained and are ready to hit the road.

Bernadette Hayes made a motion to appoint Beth Botke to finish the fiscal year as our Assessor, Julie Havens second, and it carried.

No objections were made concerning Nathan Beck's Case PC-32-13 SLU/SP and Case PC30-13 PUD/FPA as long as they comply with all zoning and DEQ requirements and requests.

Bill Dershem made a motion to adjourn, Dan Jorae supported, the motion carried.
