

His RAE scores qualified him for the AKC Rally National and he will be competing there this spring. He also took High Combined Score at all breed trials twice and once at the Regional during the Malamute National.

Lucy, RO2 UCH Powderhound's Blaze of Glory WWPDX WTD WPD CGCA RE VAM AAAM ROMWDA earned her RO2, ROMWD, and ROMWDA. The last two are Register Of Merit titles offered by the Alaskan Malamute Club of America for having produced 4 or more working titled offspring at those respective levels.

GP, Powderhound's Show Me The Way WWPDA WPD RN CGC earned his WWPDA and WPD. The first is a working weight pull dog advanced and the second is a basic backpacking title.

Nellie, AG1 Powderhound's Over and Over Again WWPDA WPD RN earned her WWPDA, WPD, and RN in 2016. Her scores qualified her for the AKC Rally National same as her father Bumper. Unfortunately she did not get in due to the limits. She completed her AG1 title in 2017 already at the Bark River UKC trials.

If you were given pictures of other malamutes, the big light grey one with the pointier face is named Quinn, AG1 Powderhound N TwoMoon's Jump For Joy WWPD OAP OJP and his owner is both a club winner and new title earner from that weekend in AG1. Owners Jackie and Dave Yahn. The dark grey and white from that trial is Bumper.

Layla, Powderhound's Woo The Masses WWPDX OA NAJ NF RN ROMWDX earned her RN, ROMWDA, and ROMWDX in 2016. Her Rally scores qualified her for the AKC Rally National as well. From The Director of Training

Hi Everyone:

Just to keep you up to date about what the Training Committee is doing I thought I would pen a short letter. We meet on Feb 1 to go over the training criteria that were submitted to us from the groups. They had some very good ideas in their papers. We reviewed them and made a few additions and corrections to them and expanded the scope of each class a little as well. I think we have a really nice basis for the classes to go by from here on out. I will be getting these back to the group leaders for them to review and share with the group members. Once all of this is finalized we will make up either individual class books, or even instructor manuals. There are some really great changes coming to the classes and I am excited to get them going. My goal for this is the fall session.

We also took the opportunity to discuss a few other topics that are in the very early planning stages. We are looking at making some minor changes to the Monday night classes but want to meet with a representative group of them before we proceed. With the expansion of the scope of the classes we also, along with the board, will discuss changing our session schedule to 3 sessions of about 15 weeks long with some breaks during them. This is in the very early planning process yet and it wouldn't start until next year and there are a lot of details to work put yet. I think this will help out with being able to have instructor meetings, short one night seminars on training techniques, club meetings and we would then also then have an achievement match at the end of each session.

I am happy to announce that we have added 2 new instructors to our group. Karen Johnson who will teach open and the lower level classes and Joan Christensen who will teach Rally, novice and prenovice classes for us. We really do need more instructors all across the board, all nights of the weeks. If you would like to instruct please let me know and the committee will discuss it. Keep an eye out for updates in each of the newsletters and of course if you have any ideas or suggestions please let a committee member or myself know.

As the obedience committee member of our newly created Training Committee I plan on putting a short message in each edition of our newsletter to let everyone know what is happening with our Obedience classes.

Mark had an instructors meeting on Jan 13. Among other things, we discussed criteria for our rally and obedience classes. We now have the criteria in place. This will be a help to us as instructors to know in what class our students belong and when they are qualified to move up to the next class.

On February 10, I met with obedience instructors and some Monday night instructors for a short 30 minute meeting. One of the things we discussed is our need for obedience instructors. I am not concerned with how many obedience titles you have. Obviously you need to be familiar with ring procedures to teach a class. But to me the important skills needed are a willingness to work with and enjoy both people and dogs. I would like to see people who are organized and motivated. I can teach you what you need to know about dog training and I would not put someone in a class until I am sure they are ready. My plan is to give the potential instructor some private training and then let them assist in a class until they are ready to take a class on their own.

After our 30 minute meeting we showed a portion of a video by Forrest Micke on how to engage your dog so that he is interested in working with you, This was open to anyone to attend. Many people brought wonderful snacks and the video was over by 8:00 so it was not a late evening.

The next instructor's meeting will be on Friday, April 7 at 6:30 pm. We will show a video at 7:00 pm, which will run until approximately 8:15 pm. Again everyone is welcome to come see the video.

WWCDTC is an outstanding dog training club with many talented people involved. My hope is to raise the quality of our training classes to an even higher level. We can do that by learning all we can about dog training techniques. Fortunately Mark has ordered many new DVDs that are now in our library. Check them out, skip a night of TV and give yourself a night to learn something new about dog training. Happy Training!

Rally Program Enhancements The Board reviewed a Staff recommendation to create two additional Rally classes – the Intermediate class and the Master class. In terms of difficulty, the Intermediate class is between the current Novice and Advanced classes. The Master class will be more difficult than the Excellent class.
