Interlaken Community Action Group

ICAG is a committee of the local government, the Village of Interlaken and as such considered a charitable organization. This publication explains how to claim a deduction and clarifies the types of organizations to whom you can make a charitable donation. It also discusses how much you can deduct, what records you must keep, and how to report charitable contributions.

CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS: A charitable contribution is a donation or gift to a qualified organization. It is a voluntary donation without no expectation to get anything of value in return. Table 1 is a list that includes some of the organizations meeting that standard.

CLAIMING A DONATION AND REQUIRED


RECEIPTS: You can claim these donations on your tax returns using a Schedule A form (table 2) or an 8283 form (table 3). It's advisable to have a signed receipt from the organization and a requirement for anything over a \$250 value.

Deductible As Charitable Contributions

Money or property you give to:

- Churches, synagogues, temples, mosques, and other religious organizations
- Federal, state, and local governments, if your contribution is solely for public purposes (for example, a gift to reduce the public debt or maintain a public park)
- Nonprofit schools and hospitals
- The Salvation Army, American Red Cross, CARE, Goodwill Industries, United Way, Boy Scouts of America, Girl Scouts of America, Boys and Girls Clubs of America, etc.
- War veterans' groups
