## Janet Arnold Rees

Janet Arnold Rees has been part of the greater Phoenix Jewish community since 1957. She has been working for Jewish Family and Children's Services (JFCS) for three years as the Concierge to the Senior Jewish community, connecting older adults to services and programs they need and want. In 2017, she developed the JFCS Creative Aging Program and is now the Coordinator for the program, which offers participatory arts classes to those over 60.



## Kathy Rood

Kathy Rood is a licensed counselor with JFCS who manages social service programs for the Older Adult and Jewish Communities. She has been with the agency for 19 years. Kathy also manages services for the Holocaust survivor community as well as for Jewish families in our community that struggle to meet their basic needs. This year she created a new monthly Memory Café Program for those with memory issues along with their care partners.



## Beverly Rubenstein

Hailing from Chicago, Beverly Rubenstein has been an active member of the Phoenix Jewish community since the 1980's. A long-time public speaker and some-time writer, she was intrigued when she saw the offering of the JFCS Creative Aging class in Story Telling. She joined the first session in early 2017 and was hooked. Her stories are based on real life situations and she has enjoyed performing around the Valley.






