



The LIT program allows our older campers who are not old enough to be CITs, to assist younger campers at certain times throughout the day.

Eligibility

All campers entering 7th grade or higher in fall of 2020 are eligible to participate in our LIT program.

Program Overview

LITs will help campers in grades K-4 at various times of the camp day. This opportunity to help younger campers will be available 1 period a day for LITs entering 7th grade and 2 periods a day for LITs entering 8th or 9th grade. Additional opportunities may be given if the schedule allows. If an LIT wishes to stay with their group at their regularly scheduled activity, instead of helping out at another activity, they may do so without question. This allows them the flexibility to help the activities and age groups that they enjoy working with most. After each LIT period, the counselors will provide feedback to the administration. In future years, preference will be given to CIT applicants who have most successfully participated in the LIT program. However, participation in the LIT program is not required to apply for a CIT opportunity when your camper becomes eligible (age 14).

How to Apply

Parents must register their campers through the normal camper registration process on our website. LITs will be charged the standard camper tuition (or the early bird rate if registered by 2/29/20). The LIT sign-up form will be emailed to all eligible campers a few days before they are scheduled to attend camp and can be handed in on their first day. There is no other advance sign-up necessary, other than the regular camper registration. A camper can join the LIT program on any Monday – but not in the middle of a week. There will be no LIT periods on the camper's first day of the summer.

Expectation

LITs will be provided with a list of expectations for participating in the program. A more detailed list will be provided during the summer however these are the general rules for the program:

1. If an LIT chooses to go to an area to assist, they are expected to be at the assigned area for the entire period. Wandering around camp will not be tolerated.
2. While assisting at an activity, LITs are expected to help the counselors and campers.
3. LIT's are expected to be role models to younger campers.

In the event that an LIT does not meet the expectations of the program first a warning will be provided to the LIT. On a second offense a final warning will be provided to the LIT and the parents will be notified. Upon the third offense the camper will no longer be able to participate in the LIT program. In this case they will continue on with the camp program like other campers who are not LITs. Refunds of camp tuition will not be made for removal from the LIT program.
