Ordinance no 985-

An Ordinance amending Sections 3 and 28 of ordinance 464, being an ordinance concerning the water works of the City of Garnett, and repealing said Sections 3 and 28.

Be it ordained by the governing body of the City of Garnett:

Section 1. That Sections 3 and 28 of Ordinance 464 be amended to read as follows
Section 3. All water used by consumers shall be measured by meter and all bills must be paid monthly, and every person using water from the water works of the city shall be required to deposit with the city clerk, at the time of making application for a supply of water, the sum of \$ 3.00 to be applied toward the payment for the water consumed ~~###~~ by such applicant, which amount of money shall remain on deposit with the city as long as such applicant shall use water from the water works of the city, and when such consumer shall cease using water from the city, after the payment of the amount due the city for water used by such consumer, said deposit shall be returned to such applicant.

Section 28. Each person taking water from the city shall pay as a compensation for taking the service pipe from the water main in the street to the outside line of the sidewalk along the front end of the lot on which the consumers property is located, the sum of \$8.50, which amount shall be in addition to the regular water rates, and must accompany the application for water.




Section 2. That Sections 3 and 28 of ordinance Number 464 are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from its passage and approval and its publication in The Garnett Review.
