Our special guest visitor this month was Storyteller Diane Edgecomb. <http://www.livingmyth.com/> The students enjoyed an interactive large-group presentation with Diane. During her visit, she shared Winter stories, including the classic fairy tale “Snow White and Rose Red,” in which a bear comes to a little cottage seeking shelter in a blizzard and, at the end, turns into a prince full of kindness. Diane also shared the story of “Gluscabe and the Wind Eagle,” a Native American legend in which Gluscabe – the Native American giant said to live in the mountains of the Northeast – ties up the Wind Eagle so he can paddle his canoe without being blown back to shore. Lots of fun ensues as Gluscabe learns that it is more important to ask for what we need (use our words) than to just act. Diane was given permission to retell this story from Native American author and storyteller Joseph Bruchac.

Classroom A Newsletter January 2026

Dear Classroom A families,

Happy New Year Everyone! We hope everyone enjoyed the holiday season. We can't believe we are already halfway through the school year. This month has been very busy as we settled back in after the winter break. We have had a cold month! It is very cold outside, so please remember to send warm clothes for recess, such as hats, mittens, snow pants, and winter coats.



Please send all winter gear every day with these cold temperatures (even if there is no snow). We love to go outside as much as possible. When the temperature is above 15 degrees (including the wind chill), we will be outside. Please label all your child's belongings, as clothing can get mixed up when they are getting ready for recess or taking their outdoor clothing off.

Sensory bin

This month, the children are learning about the four seasons in the Sensory bin. We read a book called "Little Tree" by Loren Long. The book describes the four seasons and how trees change with each season. In the sensory bin, we have winter, fall, spring, and summer.



Geography

This month in Geography, the children are learning about Antarctica. They enjoy learning about parts of a penguin and are also learning about the animals found in Antarctica. The children are being introduced to different types of icebergs.

Cultural Studies

This month, we talked about New Year's Day, which happens on the first day of January. The children learned that we celebrate the New Year

Classroom B Newsletter January 2026

Dear classroom B families,

Happy New Year! We are so happy to be back at school after our long winter break! The children are working hard in the classroom as they settle back into the school routine.

We have also been having a lot of fun in the snow recently! The children in both classes worked together to build a snowman!

Traditional Indian Clothing



This month, Mehr's mom, Sakshi Saini, joined our class to teach the children about traditional Indian clothing. She brought in many beautiful garments, including *saris*, which are a traditional dress many women wear. She also brought in traditional men's clothing called a *kurta*. Sakshi pointed out that many saris have detailed embroidery.



After the presentation, the children participated in a craft activity, decorating their own sari or kurta. Thank you, Sakshi, for providing this presentation and craft for our class!

Storyteller Presentation

This month, we had a special visitor, Storyteller Diane Edgecomb. Diane is a storytelling and story-making artist committed to the transformative power that happens between teller and audience at live performances. The children really enjoyed her creative and funny way of telling the story.



Diane asked volunteers to help her tell the story of *The Freezing Snowman*. Here volunteers from classroom A and B are using props - a scarf, hat and mittens while Diane (as the snowman) asks them for the warm clothes. In the story the snowman does not know how to ask politely. The children help to teach the snowman to ask for something with kind manners, such as saying please. This presentation blended wonderfully with our Grace & Courtesy curriculum.



Science

Our class has been learning about magnetic and nonmagnetic properties this month. The children learned that magnets are special objects that can attract certain metals. Magnets work due to an invisible force called magnetism.

Math

The children have been working with counting 0-10 and 11-20 with woodland animals. Initially they begin with numbers 0-10 and then move on to 11-20. These materials change with the seasons. The children often get excited seeing a new counting material on the shelf!



Geography

Throughout January and into February the children are learning many fascinating facts about North America. They discovered that North America is the continent where we live and is made up of several countries. Each country has its own states or provinces. We also discovered that throughout the continent there are different geographical areas called biomes.



Kindergarten corner

The life cycle of a frog is one of those special and memorable curricula topics. Everyone was very excited to learn everything they could about frogs, starting with the adult frog laying eggs. After several weeks, the eggs hatch into a tadpole with a long tail. As the tadpole grows, it undergoes metamorphosis and will develop back legs. Next the front legs will grow, and the tail will shorten, as the tadpole becomes a froglet. The last stage is an adult frog.

January 2026 Extended Day Newsletter

Happy New Year! We welcomed 2026 with some New Year's resolutions, winter-themed crafts, and science experiments.

Our group project this month was all about making New Year's resolutions. We defined a resolution as something positive that we want to try or do more of in the new year. Some examples of resolutions we thought of included spending more time with family, trying new foods, and playing at the trampoline park more often.

For **arts and crafts**, we embraced winter with snow-themed projects like making snowflakes and engaging in winter sports like skating. We also had some open-ended craft activities, and to end the month, we focused on a Winnie the Pooh theme.

In **science**, we did a snowstorm-in-a-jar experiment and a dissolving-snowman experiment. For the snowstorm in a jar, we mixed water and white paint in a cup. Then we poured baby oil into the jar and added our water mixture. We learned that water and oil do not mix because oil is less dense than water. Next, we added Alka-Seltzer a little at a time, triggering a chemical reaction that produced bubbles that looked like snowfall. In the dissolving snowman experiment, we used biodegradable packing peanuts made from starch and drew snowman faces on them. We had two cups of water—one at room temperature and one warm. We placed two packing peanuts in each cup. The packing peanuts in warm-water cup dissolved immediately, while those in the room-temperature cup took a little longer. The science behind this is that water molecules pull apart the packing peanuts' molecules.

Our Extended Day program continues to grow in enrollment. Please inform the office in advance if you plan to add your child to the program. Remember that the extended day begins after the full day pickup ends (2:30-2:40 pm). If you have any questions, please ask Andrea.

The morning and afternoon Extended Day Programs offer a safe, fun and welcoming environment where children are offered age-appropriate activities which promote learning opportunities and social interaction with staff and classmates. This program is held in the front classroom of the school and on the playground.
