March 9-20, 2019**

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## **Saturday, March 9**

Arrive Tel Aviv Ben Gurion Airport. Transfer on your own to our hotel. We will enjoy a fabulous 'Kick Off' dinner at a Yemenite restaurant starting around 7:30 pm.

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## **Sunday, March 10**

After a full Israeli breakfast, we travel along the Mediterranean coast to the ruins of Caesarea. Onward, we see the magnificent panoramic view from Mount Carmel. We'll continue on to the excavation of Tel Megiddo overlooking the Valley of Armageddon (Jezreel Valley). The ruins of Megiddo are 26 civilizations deep going back to the Canaanites. Crossing the valley we ascend the Mount of Precipice near Nazareth before we proceed to our hotel in Tiberias.

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## **Monday, March 11**

Early this morning we go northward to ancient Tel Dan, where the Dan tribe immigrated. We visit the unearthed city gates and remains of fortifications. We also visit Caesarea Philippi / Baniyas, where Peter confessed Christ as Messiah and which is also one of four sources of the Jordan River. Our journey then takes us back to the shores of the Sea of Galilee to visit the earliest sites in Jesus' ministry including two synagogues, the site of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, and a beach where Jesus told Peter to 'feed my sheep.' We will end our day viewing an ancient fishing boat from the time of Jesus, follow by a time of worship aboard a Galilean boat while cruising the Sea of Galilee.

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## **Tuesday, March 12**

On our journey today we visit Jesus' boyhood home and experience the recreated Nazareth Village. We will also explore Sepphoris where we see exquisite mosaics, including the "Mona Lisa of the Galilee." Along the way we enjoy lunch in Cana and then southward stopping at the Decapolis city of Beit She'an. The ancient city on the hill is where Saul and his sons were hung after their defeat at Gilboa. It is one of the best preserved of all the Decapolis cities.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER AND OVERNIGHT GALILEE

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## **Wednesday, March 13**

After breakfast we begin our day at Gideon Springs before crossing the Sheik Hussein Bridge. After clearing customs we say goodbye to our Israeli guide, then cross into the friendly and fascinating Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. We ascend the eastern mountains of the Gilead to the Decapolis city of Jerash (biblical Gerasa). This ancient city — a blend of the Greco-Roman world of the Mediterranean Basin and the ancient traditions of the Arab Orient — is considered one of the largest and most well preserved sites of Roman architecture in the world outside Italy. Leaving Jerash, we cross the Zarqa (biblical Jabbok) River, then pass through Amman, and descend to the Jordan river to visit the area where John the Baptist baptized and where Elijah ascended into heaven on a chariot of fire. Ascending up to Madaba we see a large mosaic map of the Holy Land. We will then journey through the desert to Petra and settle in for the night.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER AND OVERNIGHT PETRA

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**Thursday, March 14****Petra**

After a delicious Jordanian breakfast, we arrive at the entrance to the Siq, which leads us to Petra. Walking about a mile leads us to the end of the narrow canyon, which opens spectacularly to the Treasury, carved out of predominantly red stone. Further down, the valley opens to even more wonders. After a late lunch we will travel northward to Amman.

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**Friday, March 15****Mount Nebo, Mosaic Factory, Allenby Bridge,  
Genesis Land, City of David, Welcome Shabbat**

After breakfast we travel across the fields of Moab to Mount Nebo, where weather permitting; we see a panoramic view from where God showed Moses the Promise Land. We also see recently restored mosaics on the floor of the Nebo church. We then descend to the Jordan River where we say farewell to our Jordanian guide and cross into Israel for a Bedouin lunch at Abraham's tent. Our afternoon will include a visit to the City of David and at sundown we plan to welcome Shabbat with others in Jerusalem.

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**Saturday, March 16****Mount Olives, Inn of the Good Samaritan,  
Qumran, Ein Gedi, Masada, Dead Sea**

We drive to Mount Olives for an outstanding view of the city and surrounding area. As we travel toward the Dead Sea area we see preserved mosaic at the Inn of the Good Samaritan. We then continue down to the Jordan River Valley to Qumran, where we will view the caves where Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Continuing southward we will enjoy the seclusion of Ein Gedi where David hid from Saul. After lunch we ascend by cable car to the top of Masada where we walk this massive and inspiring historical site. If time and weather permit we will have an opportunity to float in the Dead Sea.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER AND OVERNIGHT JERUSALEM

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**Sunday, March 17****Israel Museum, Yad Vashem, Bethlehem, Hill of Ill Council**

This morning we proceed through modern Jerusalem to the Israel Museum where we walk around the amazing model of Jesus' Jerusalem and visit the Shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea Scroll collection is exhibited. We then proceed to Yad Vashem where we will see memorials to those lost in the Holocaust. Our afternoon will be spent visiting Bethlehem and meeting wonderful people who live and work and bring hope to their community. We return to our hotel stopping for a nighttime view of the Temple Mount from an overlook on the Hill of Ill Council.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER AND OVERNIGHT JERUSALEM

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**Monday, March 18****Caiaphas House, Herodian Mansions & Burnt House, Oriental  
Bazaar, Davidson Archeological Park, Kotel Tunnel**

Our day starts at Caiaphas' house where Jesus faced accusers. We descend under the Jewish Quarter to see the Herodian Mansions. Close by is the Burnt House where you see evidence of the destruction that came to Jerusalem by the Romans in 70AD. We next see Hezekiah's Broad wall, the Jerusalem Oriental Bazaar, and finally Davidson Archeological Park near the Temple Mount. Our day ends with a walk through the Kotel Tunnel where we gain a glimpse of the engineering required to build the Temple Mount.

BREAKFAST, LUNCH, DINNER AND OVERNIGHT JERUSALEM

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**Tuesday, March 19****Gethsemane, St Anne, Pool of Bethesda,  
Via Dolorosa, Garden Tomb, Farewell dinner**

Today will be very full as we begin in the Garden of Gethsemane, where we see the Church of All Nations and the Palm Sunday route of Jesus into the Old City. We enter Old City through the Lions Gate near the site of Stephen's martyrdom. We will stop at the Pool of Bethesda just inside the gate and sing in the acoustical marvel of Saint Anne's church. Continuing along the traditional Via Dolorosa toward the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Our day concludes at the Garden Tomb (Gordon's Calvary), which allow us to end our journey in reflection and communion.
