December Reflection

Brothers and Sisters,

I can vividly remember being a child in elementary school, and watching the clock as it seemed to stand still waiting for Christmas break to officially begin. If I pause long enough, I can still hear my Nike's squeaking on the linoleum of Mrs. Duncan's classroom, as it felt like Christmas would never come. Flash forward to today and I am trying to figure out how to make time stand still so I can get everything I need done. As I write this the Monday before Thanksgiving, I am somewhat concerned that I should have started planning for this season back in July.

In the midst of the craziness and business of this Christmas season, we here in Church strive to point to something much more important than the commercialization that has taken over this season. As we prepare to enter this holy season of Advent, I invite you to pause, breathe, and receive once again the deep gift this season offers. Advent is far more than the countdown to Christmas it is a sacred time of waiting watching and preparing our hearts for the transforming presence of Christ.

Advent teaches us the spiritual practice of waiting. Scripture is filled with God's people waiting, Israel waiting for deliverance, the prophets waiting for God's justice, Mary waiting for her child. These stories remind us that waiting is not wasted time, but a place where faith is shaped. In our own lives of faith we too wait, for healing, for guidance, for renewed strength. Advent assures us that God meets us in these waiting places is already at work in ways we cannot yet see.

The candles of Advent help guide our journey. The first candle symbolizes hope, and it reminds us that even the faintest light can push back the darkness, and there is no darkness so strong that it can overpower the light. Our hope is not wishful thinking, or in our own powers or devices. Our hope is firmly rooted in God. As Paul reminds us in Romans 5, "We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit."

The second candle that we light represents peace. This is not the fragile peace the world offers, that never actually represents peace. The peace of God is not passive; it is not the absence of conflict, but rather the presence of God in the midst of it. When Christ enters the world, he does not eliminate the turmoils surrounding him, rather he embodies peace so fully that even storms must bow before his word.

The third is the candle of joy. It is a different color, pink, symbolizing a shift in tone. In the mist of waiting and longing, joy bursts forth as a reminder that God's work is already unfolding. Joy is not the same

as happiness, happiness is fleeting, dependent on circumstances, while joy is anchored in the presence of God. Advent joy reminds us that God delights in surprising us.

The fourth candle, centers us on the very heartbeat of the gospel, love. Advent love is not sentimental; it is incarnational. It is God taking on flesh, entering our world not from a distance but from within. Love that saves, love that heals; love that does not give up, love that is always looking for that one lost sheep. In Jesus Christ we see the fullness of God's love revealed; a love that comes close, that stoops down, that welcomes, that forgives, that transforms.

Theologically Advent grounds us in the story of salvation. We remember Christ's first coming to Bethlehem, we rejoice in His presence with us now, and look forward with hope to his coming again. Advent teaches us to live faithfully between promise and fulfillment. It forms us as disciples, helps us to slow down, practice prayer, and open our lives to Christ's renewing work. For us as First UMC Cherryville, Advent is an opportunity to refocus our hearts. It calls us to worship with intention, to strengthen our life together and to renew our commitment to mission and service. This season also invites us to generosity, compassion, and gratitude, reminding us that Christ is born not only in Bethlehem but also in every act of love shared in his name.


My prayer for you this Advent is simple: that Christ will meet you where you are. If you are weary, may he renew your strength. If you are grieving, may he surround you with comfort. If you are joyful, may he deepen your gratitude. And if you feel distant from God, may this season lead you home. As we light the candles each week, may their glow remind us that Christ, the true Light, has come, is with us now, and will come again in glory. Let us walk through this holy time together with hearts open to wonder, hope, and the renewing work of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



\$10,351.99 - still needed to fund project.


