


**El Santuario de los Pobladores**

Our promise and dedication towards completing the Santuario in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe and Mysteries of the Rosary perseveres and each day brings us closer to its completion. Gravel has been spread in front and around the east and west sides of the labyrinth. Trees (6) have been planted. As donations are received, more trees will be placed. We have also planted shrubs and flower bushes and surrounded the area with gravel. Adobe dedication plaques are now in place in the labyrinth courtyard and placement of plaques continue. Once all these are in place, merchants who have supported our project, will also be acknowledged. Each outlying mission will have its own mission statue displayed when funds are available. 

**Theme: Temptation and Sin.**

Since human beings are both God's masterpiece and fallen creatures, temptation and sin are daily realities which no psychology can talk away. It may be true that "temptation and sin" have been overemphasized in the past. Theologians were wont to offer long lists of sins, listed for the most part under the tag of "mortal" and "venial," whereas the reality is not quite so simple. However, this does not mean that temptation and sin are all of a sudden nonexistent either.

Sin is willfully breaking that beautiful love-relationship with God that is called grace. We do not accomplish this easily, although we are tempted daily not to live up to the ideal of love of God and neighbor as we should. Whether or not our daily failures should be called "sin" is not important. But we should not take them for granted. One of the great temptations that ruin beautiful relationships (marriage, friendship) is the routine of daily failures. It is a kind of indifference that renders a love-relationship stale and trite. Finally, it gets boring and the next step is a breakup.

Today's Bible readings should make us take a realistic look at our relationship with our marriage partner, friends, children, and parents in whom God approaches us and our direct relationship with God in both private prayer and

worship. Beware of the temptation of indifference!

**FIRST READING REFLECTION**

**Gn 2:7-9; 3:1-7: [Sin of Our First Parents]**

Who am I? Who am I supposed to be? I am dust (Ash Wednesday) but also related to God. Inspired by God, the sacred writer uses a beautiful allegory to teach us about the reality of temptation and sin in our lives. Notice the woman (you and I) playing with temptation! The proposal is pleasing to her eyes! After some hesitation, the consent follows. Then the eyes of the man and woman are opened. Too late of course! You and I could do the same! The Responsorial Psalm is an act of Contrition

**SECOND READING REFLECTION**

**Rom 5:12-19 or 5:12, 17-19 [Saved Through Christ]**

Paul draws up an analogy between the Adam of Genesis and Jesus Christ, "the man to come." Adam began a history of fallen humanity, marked by sin and death. Jesus Christ began a new history of humanity, marked by forgiveness of sin and life everlasting. Fallen human beings can pray hopefully: "Give me back the joy of your salvation" (Responsorial Psalm), since Jesus Christ atoned for our sins by his obedience even to the death on a cross.

## Understanding Lent

### WALKING WITH CHRIST TOWARD EASTER

Lent is a sacred season, a time set apart for renewal of heart and soul. Each year, the Church invites us to step away from distractions and walk with Christ in a deeper way. For forty days, we trace his footsteps—entering the desert with him, learning to listen, pray, and trust. This sacred journey mirrors the rhythm of our own lives: seasons of challenge that prepare us for new life in God.

The practices of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—are not burdens but pathways. **Prayer** deepens our friendship with God, opening our hearts to his voice. **Fasting** teaches us that we are not ruled by our appetites but created for something greater—communion with God himself. **Almsgiving** lifts our gaze outward, reminding us that love of neighbor is inseparable from love of God. These disciplines work together to form us, to free us, and to awaken us to the life of grace already present within us.

Lent is not simply about what we "give up." It is about what we receive: mercy, forgiveness, and renewal. By offering small sacrifices and acts of love, we allow God's Spirit to reshape our hearts. In this way, conversion becomes not a single act but a daily turning—away from sin and toward Christ.

We do not walk this road alone. The entire Church journeys together, nourished by Scripture, strengthened by the Eucharist, and inspired by the saints who have gone before us. Even in our struggles, God is near, leading us through the desert to the joy of Easter morning. Ultimately, Lent prepares us for the Resurrection. By walking the way of the cross with Jesus, we come to know more fully the life that only he can give. And when Easter dawns, our Alleluia rings out with deeper joy because we have been renewed in heart and spirit. May this Lent be a season of grace for you, a time of prayerful return to the Lord, and a journey that leads you into the radiant light of Easter.

#### THE MEANING OF LENT

The word Lent comes from the Old English lencten, meaning "springtime." In the Church, Lent refers to the forty-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that prepares us for Easter. The number forty has biblical significance: Moses fasted forty days before receiving the Ten Commandments, Elijah journeyed forty days to Mount Horeb, and Jesus fasted forty days in the desert. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes at the start of the Paschal Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Sundays are not counted in the forty days, as each Sunday is a "little Easter," a celebration of the Resurrection.

The focus of Lent is conversion of heart. The Church encourages us to pray more faithfully, fast from food or distractions, and give generously to the poor. These practices are not ends in themselves but signs that we are turning away from sin and toward God. Lent invites us to renew our baptismal commitment and prepare joyfully for the Resurrection of Jesus

#### SYMBOLS AND PRACTICES OF LENT

Lent is rich with symbols that help us live out this season of renewal. The most visible sign is the **ash cross** traced on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. It reminds us of our mortality—"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return"—and of our call to repentance.


The **liturgical color purple** is used in churches throughout Lent, symbolizing penance, humility, and preparation. In some parishes, crucifixes and statues may be veiled in the final weeks, creating a sense of longing and anticipation for Easter's joy. Another central devotion is the **Stations of the Cross**, traditionally prayed on Fridays during Lent. By reflecting on Christ's Passion step by step, we learn to unite our own sufferings with his and to see the depth of his love.

Many Catholics also embrace **simplicity and silence** during Lent—reducing entertainment, quieting daily noise, and creating space for God's voice. Acts of service and charity flow naturally from this spirit, reminding us that Lent is not just about discipline but love of neighbor. The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** holds special importance, offering grace and renewal as we return to God's mercy.

The Church teaches that Catholics in **good health** are to observe the following rules for **fasting and abstinence**. From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops:

**"Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Fasting is required from age 18 until age 59. It permits one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat binds Catholics from age 14 and older."**

Together, these symbols and practices point us toward the heart of Lent: a season of turning back to God and preparing to celebrate the Resurrection with renewed faith.
