Your Hometown Church Faithful to Tradition Loving in Fellowship Reaching for Tomorrow

A number of years ago there was a robust debate in the Presbyterian Church around the sacrament of Lord's Supper. The question was about who could receive the elements. For many years the standard had been that communion was for those who were baptized believers. This was the standard, which from a theological standpoint holds a lot of merit. Only those who believed and had claimed that faith and the forgiveness of sins God offers through baptism would be able to dine with the Lord and receive the blessings that Christ offers. This also kept the sacrament sacred and promoted structure so that us Presbyterians could do things "decently and in order". There are scriptural references about how communion should come after selfexamination, (see 1 Corinthians 11:27-30) that were used to support this understanding. The other side of the debate argued that communion should be open to everyone who wishes to receive it. This argument had two main points. Theologically the argument was that God's love is open to everyone, just as a relationship with Christ is open to everyone. The second was a more practical argument which is that a pastor has no real way of knowing who is baptized and who is not and isn't going to ask every person who wishes to participate in communion.

Ultimately the second understanding won out and our denomination largely approves of what is called an "Open Table", meaning that we believe the Lord's Table is open to everyone, always, no exceptions. Aside from the practical aspect I do like this policy because I believe it is more hospitable to guests and seems to me, to be more in line with how Jesus lives and taught. It seems everyone was always welcome at Jesus' table, even those nasty tax collectors and vile sinners! I bring this up because it is my hope that the church's increased hospitality would not be limited to the sacrament of communion.

The passage from 1 Peter 4:8-9 encourages us to love one another and to be hospitable to each

other. Hospitality means to be friendly, welcoming, and generous to guests and/or strangers.


This directive from Peter is about how we who are in the church should treat one another and welcome outsiders. And Christian hospitality isn't just about a smiling face and nice word on Sunday morning. Christian hospitality is about inviting people into your life, into your home, into your circle.

I know this is a hard and sometimes scary or awkward thing. To approach someone you don't know after worship can be intimidating. But your kindness and warmth this week might be the reason they return next week. We must take the initiative to be hospitable, to connect with people and to sometimes help visitors connect with others in the congregation. I am not a car enthusiast, but I know several people in the church who are, so when a visitor comes with a passion for automobiles I might say "have you met so and so", and then help to make that connection. This is all part of what it means to be hospitable at the church. But we must take this even further. We must be hospitable in our daily lives. Welcoming people in to our lives, inviting them to share meals with us, being generous and caring toward them. This is what it means to have Christian hospitality. Our church offers an open table; I am encouraging you to exercise an open table in your homes. And remember, in all things, strive to love one another. For love covers a multitude of sins!

### Mission Trip to TCM's Haus Edelweiss

On June 1st, VPC's Kim Jason and former staff member Cherie Loomis will be traveling to Austria to serve as Short-Term Workers at TCM's Haus Edelweiss.

TCM International Institute provides graduate-level Christian leadership training for pastors, teachers and other church leaders from 45+ countries in Europe, Central Asia, the Middle East and Africa. Haus Edelweiss is TCM's main campus, where courses are held from March–November. After completing coursework and exams online, students come to Haus Edelweiss for a 10-day session of intensive training and practical application with their professors. Haus Edelweiss has a full-time staff of 8 people. But when a session begins, the Haus becomes a bustling campus with up to 130 students, professors and translators.

To serve this influx of people, 12-14 Short-Term Workers are needed for Food Services (preparing 3 meals a day for up to 150 people), Guest Services (housekeeping, laundry), Maintenance (buildings and interior), and Groundskeeping (mowing, trimming, tending flower beds).

Kim and Cherie will join other Short-Term Workers from various parts of the United States, who will be assigned to one of these work areas. As they serve, they will have the opportunity to meet and share meals with students from various countries, learn about how God is working through these disciple-makers, and share the love of Jesus with brothers and sisters in Christ from many parts of the world. Please pray for Kim and Cherie as they GO in the name of Jesus. Pray for safe travel, health, energy, good rest, and that they will experience the love of Christ in a very special way!
