### "Hot Rodders of Tomorrow"

FIVE "Hot Rodders of Tomorrow" <u>Teams</u> Qualify at Tarrant County College



Nine teams of five students from seven different schools in Texas and Oklahoma competed at the fourth Hot Rodders of Tomorrow ("HROT") Engine Challenge event of the season, hosted at Tarrant County College in Fort Worth, Texas, on March 24, 2018. Five teams made the cut and will have a chance to win thousands of dollars in college scholarships at the 2018 Dual National Championship Playoffs in November and December at the SEMA Show and PRI show, respectively.

To qualify for the Dual National Championship, a team must finish <u>disassembling</u> and <u>reassembling</u> a small-block Chevrolet engine in less than thirty-three (33) minutes, including penalties.

Team Custom Automotive Network (CAN) from Eastern Oklahoma County Tech Center in Choctaw, Oklahoma, won first place with a blistering time of **19:36**, and yes, that is nineteen minutes and thirty-six seconds to tear down and then rebuild (to specific torque and assembly specifications). Two teams from Hereford High School out of Hereford, Texas, participated and qualified: Team Proform took second place with a time of 27:40 and Team Vibrant Performance came in fourth with 30:46. Team Comp Cams from Pontotoc Tech Center from Ada, Texas took third place with a 29:14 time. The fifth-place qualifier was first-time participant Team PRW from J. W. Nixon High School in Laredo, Texas, with the time of 32:05.

"This is a great program that is really going to benefit my students," said Abel Sanchez, the instructor at J. W. Nixon High School. "One of my students is a senior and going to attend UTI and the scholarship is really going to help him out. The team comes from a low social economic background and the HROT program will benefit students for years to come." Text and photo from: Tomorrow's Tech

This event is held each year at Tarrant County College. In conjunction with this event, Painless Performance also sponsors the annual National Street Rod Association's Appreciation Day (NSRA). Bobby Stout, NSRA North Texas State Representative, said "We believe it is a great opportunity to let these aspiring hot rodders of tomorrow actually see the same Chevy 350 cubic inch engine that the students are using during the competition actually installed in some of the hot rods and street rods and trucks. The trucks dominated the parking lot this year,". Bobby also stated that it is very entertaining to watch these young people, both as individuals and specifically to watch them all work as a team unit.

Follow these young men and women as they journey to Las Vegas for the National Finals in the Hot Rodders of Tomorrow challenge.
