

## Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity

**Psalm 91:10** "There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling."

No evil is able to get near you. This means you have Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity.

What exactly is Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity? Diplomatic immunity is a form of legal immunity that ensures that diplomats are given safe passage and are considered not susceptible to lawsuit or prosecution under the host country's laws ([http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Diplomatic\\_immunity](http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Diplomatic_immunity)).

As we trust God with all our hearts, the sovereign hand of God filters every circumstance and happening in our lives. This is Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity.

Even in the things that Satan could use to destroy us, God's hand is evident and no evil will befall us. This is Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity. This exemption from evil is the result of putting our trust in God.

Friends, we belong to God, we have a destiny in God to fulfill. This protection and immunity are part of how we fulfill the destiny that God has for us. The suffering of Jesus is the reason why we can walk in this Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity.

We can expect protection from God from evil. What is evil? Do you know what the word "plague" means here? It means "striking blows or inflictions."

Striking blows indicates harm or intent to harm. Did you know the word "infliction" has 65 definitions? That is 65 different meanings according to the Urban Dictionary!

Here are a few: calamity, disgrace, torment, punishment, unnecessary pain, suffering. Get the picture? Do you think the word "infliction" was used by accident? It means "evil will NOT befall you and it won't come near where you are!"

This hope is not for everyone but only for those who have turned to God for their security and safety. This verse continues to bring us the imagery of Psalm 91:1-4, with emphasis on "the deadly pestilence" and Psalm 91:5-7.

No evil can happen to your soul because He promises "it won't come nigh thy dwelling." Everything is overruled for our good. We are secure when others are in peril. This exemption from evil is the result of our trust in God.

Psalm 91:10 repeats God's protection in a different imagery to give us the assurance that the Lord provides protection against destructive forces. The repetition cannot be ignored. Verse 2 claims those who have made the Lord their lodging place, their refuge, and their tent, is why no evil will be able to touch them. God is trying to drive His point home.

The interpretation of this psalm's imagery is an important key to unlocking its message. This metaphor is a picture of God's protective outreach power.

God says:

I will deliver you...

I will protect you..

I will answer you...

Next time the enemy comes at you remember you have Diplomatic Kingdom Immunity.
