A Note from Pastor Toni

Today I'm in Wales. We left the Highlands in Scotland and headed for Holy Island (Londisfarne) where Christianity was birthed in Britain by St. Aidan. Bishop Aidan, Bishop on the Isle of Iona, was commissioned by King Oswald who converted to Christianity in 635 AD. to bring the gospel to Northumbria. The king gave Aidan the isle of Lindisfarne so that he and the twelve monks who came with him, could build an Abbey and a community where people could live together, learn about the gospels and begin to live as followers of Jesus, ultimately taking the good news throughout Wales and England. Aidan's informal approach brought immediate success as he visited villages on the mainland where Aidan established schools and taught the local children to read and write; then later how to share in evangelism in and beyond Northumbria.

Despite the current fact that much of western Europe and the UK is no longer Christian, despite the fact that the U.S. is no longer seen as a "Christian nation" the presence of the Holy Spirit has lingered for centuries in the hearts of men and women who have, with a love in their hearts for Truth, carried the message of Jesus since His ascension into heaven. Yes, the church struggles, but i think that so much of our struggle is caused by our own lack of vision at times, as well as our lack of attention to spiritual disciplines that keep us focused, centered and connected to our lifeline- the Holy Spirit.

I look at the communities and churches here who have committed themselves wholeheartedly to the cause of the gospel. They live out the Acts 2 church with a deep understanding and conviction of what it means to be community; not just within the church but within the villages, towns and cities where they live. The mindset for being the church is an active presence as a collective in the schools, places of business, community events, local government, and within the artists communities. They move as one body of believers within their various diversities for one cause—to share the love of Christ—the Way, the Truth and the Life. And... they are reaching people!

People are drawn to their energy, excitement, gentleness and deep sense of love for one another and others like them or dif-

ferent from them.

Its refreshing to see this renewed conspiracy of love happening with deliberation and intent all across the UK. They call it, Messy Church. Its real, its raw, its threatening in a good way and its beautiful. Its not self-indulging, but completely about being a community of believers strategically and with intent creating new spaces for church, and it has had a serious effect across the UK and England. Its slogan is, "Church, but not as you know it."

Held on a day, other than Sunday, and not in a church, families and individuals gather to experience fun and faithformative, informal Christian activities. Its for people who have not found other forms of church engaging and who don't yet belong to a church. It explores a biblical theme through, includes hands-on creative experiences, a celebration and a meal. It is usually held once per month at a time other than Sunday morning. It does not prioritize either the needs of children or adults but intentionally welcomes and provides for all ages.

We observed a Messy Church experience in a the town of Tenby. The usual Messy Church experience includes relaxed welcome zone where people gather from their busy lives and reconnect with each other. Then activities for all ages, playing and working together, begin to explore the theme of the bible story. A short interactive celebration time of story, song and prayer followed the activity time. Finally, the worship experience culminated in a meal together. Just like the first century church!!! Reverend Greg Ross described Messy Church in this way: "1) it introduces people to the risen Christ 2) by offering the unconditional hospitality of God 3) in a way that has all ages sharing together in all parts of Messy Church 4) and in ways that strive to engage people with creative opportunities and responses, and 5) it celebrates the gift of the whole of life."

The whole of life! YUMC, we could have this same experience of being the kind of Church that Jesus created and envisioned. There are too many churches in our community that

keep to themselves and are more like the institution shaped by human-made ideas and ideologies rather than by the whole truth of the gospel!

Wouldn't it be refreshing if we could become messy?? Really messy for the sake of Christ??!

I think this is a conversation worth having and an idea worth exploring. I love YUMC and want to see it thrive but i also want our thriving to infect in a good way, so many more beyond the walls or the institutional impression of church today. That's always been my passion and i know its many of yours as well.

Jesus changed the world with 12 committed disciples, Aidan changed the world with 12 monks, we could certainly broaden our footprint in the city of Yreka and try something like the Jesus followers in the UK are doing! Church, who wants to get messy??



What none of them could have known was how transformative both the trip—and the bonds that develop between them—would prove, driving each to create a new destiny together.


