Aloha Kakou,

Last Sunday, the Second Sunday of Easter (which runs for fifty days, up to Pentecost) I noted that what happened on that first Easter Sunday is an open book. Matthew, Mark, Luke and John all have different versions of "what happened". Unlike their versions of Jesus' life, ministry, betrayal and execution, in which there is a substantial correspondence, Easter narratives are all over the place and even contradictory.

If we spend all, or even most, of our time trying to figure out the historical "facts", we'll never get to the important question of "What does this mean?" Let's not confuse "truth" with "facts". While there may be from time to time a correspondence, human/spiritual truth is not the same as cold, hard facts. In fact, I would argue there are very few "cold, hard facts" in our world.

Just consider an automobile accident, something that happens with regular frequency on our church's street corner. Despite all of the witnesses, the observers of the facts, few people can ever agree on what exactly happened when car meets car in most unpleasant of ways.

Now, add two thousand years, and the "fact" that in none of the resurrection narratives, did anyone find themselves in the tomb when Jesus rose from the dead. So, what happened? Let's say it's an open book and if you want to discuss among yourselves, feel free. But if you include me in that discussion, I'm going to jump to the more important question: *Why? What does Jesus' resurrection mean?* Why do we confess that the God who rescued Israel from Egypt also raised Jesus from the dead? What does that MEAN?

Three suggestions, which we can – and hopefully will – expand upon throughout the Easter season:

- 1. Jesus lives. He is not in the land of the dead. God raised Jesus from the dead.
- 2. Jesus is Lord. That is, in the words of the earliest Christian confession and creed ("Jesus is Lord!"), God has vindicated Jesus' ministry and death on a Cross (what we often call The Way of the Cross) as the way of life. It is God "Yes" to Jesus' healing, feeding and forgiving the downtrodden, depressed and weak of the earth, including the Earth itself. It is God affirming Jesus' resistance to systems of domination political, economic and religious that marginalized and suppressed the vulnerable of creation, of history and nature.
- 3. Jesus' resurrection is our resurrection and it is happening now. It is as real now for us as it was for Jesus' followers way back when, two thousand years ago. In prayer, song, sharing of bread and wine and reading of the Word, the Crucified One lives in, with and among us. We take that divine/incarnate Presence with us back out into our daily worlds of work and play, where we, too, can live by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone.

Alleluia! He is risen!

He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Think on that. It is the heart of our faith.
