## Time for Winterization and Snow Removal

Even though the weather forecasters are predicting half the regular amount of snow for Beech this season, anything can happen this winter. Larry Parrish will be in charge of our winter program again this year. Larry will plow when the snow fall is excessive to allow for cars to enter and exit the parking areas. Plowing will take place after the main road has been plowed. This may not be first thing in the morning. If the weather is supposed to warm to above freezing plowing may not take place as it will melt naturally. We pay Larry a set fee for each time he plows so the more he plows the more we pay. He will also shovel the snow from the front decks of permanent residents and renters and from anyone who notifies the office that they would like this service. We are trying to save money by not shoveling unoccupied units unless the snow fall is so great that it weighs down the decks.
Each building has a snow station with a shovel, snow melt and a scraper. Please use these as needed and return them to the station. All unoccupied units have been inspected to assure that the heat is on. The crawl
spaces and roof turbines have been sealed. There are heaters in each crawl space to prevent freezing of pipes. This is a good time to check your personal insurance plan to make sure it covers water damage to personal items and unit contents in case of busted pipes.
This has been our major winter crisis in the past. There is a diagram on the office door showing water cutoffs to each building and emergency contact information. In case of broken pipes the first thing is to cut the water off to the building, if possible, then notify Larry of the emergency. If you are using propane to heat, always leave the electric heat on at least 50 degree to serve as a backup in case the propane should run out. Report any windows or doors left open to prevent freezing in units.
Please use caution when walking on HBV roads and decks as ice can be a problem under the snow due to thawing and refreezing. Salt may not be used on gravel roads as it ruins the stability of the roads. Stay off all grounds as there could be plantings and rocks which could be dangerous. Snow sledding is available for children by Town Hall and should not be allowed on HBV grounds. Please report violators to the office.

Park your cars tightly to maximize spaces as winter creates our most serious parking crunches with many renters and visitors on the property. Do not block the trash can areas as the city will not be able to remove the trash. Violators will be towed at their expense. Enter and exit parking areas at low speeds and engage your $4 \times 4$, if you have it. Last year we had a car run off the road and break through decking due to excessive speeds. Please pay attention to all handicap signs. Vehicles will be ticketed and/or towed if you are not suppose to park in these spaces.
Trash on the grounds is another big problem in the winter. Please make every effort to pick up your trash and those of others if possible. Do not leave any trash bags sitting on the front decks, even for a short period of time, as the animals will get into them. Do not leave bird seed or other food outside in storage areas as animals will find a way to get into them. Larry will pick up trash periodically when needed. Let's all work together to have a safe and fun winter season. (a)
