GARAGE SALE/NEIGHBORHOOD EVENTS

Many of you have expressed an interest in having neighborhood events. So, we want you to know, that once it is safe for us to mingle, we plan to resume our classic neighborhood activities (seasonal garage sales, holiday parties, block parties, National Night Out, etc.) along with a few new ones (neighborhood bazaars, cook-offs, etc.). NEW FENCE ON GLENHILL DR. AT BERKMAN DR.

In case you have not noticed, our association worked with local businesses to get a new fence installed at the dead end of Glenhill Dr. and Berkman Dr. After numerous complaints from area residents who felt that the dead end had become dangerous and unsightly with the accumulation of trash and debris over the years, with the overgrowth of vegetation, as well as a major safety concern with daily transient foot traffic, the association requested that the local business owner clear the over-grown vegetation and erect a new fence to address our concerns. We were pleased to facilitate this effort (with our new board members' participation) to increase the overall safety and beauty of our neighborhood. This is just a small part of what our association can do to maintain the *oasis* of the Coronado Hills/ Creekside neighborhood.



NEIGHBORHOOD SPEEDING

We continue to see speeding down Coronado Hills from the four-way stop sign at Berkman. Since the drive is downhill, it's important for drivers to watch their speed and brake appropriately to maintain the 30 mph speed limit. It appears that some drivers are also exceeding the speed limit of 25 mph at the north end of Berkman Drive. We would also remind drivers to watch their speed along Glenhill given the limited visibility at the intersections of side streets on Shelbourne and Raven. Please stay alert for walkers. We have seen an increase in the numbers of our neighbors who walk the neighborhood during the pandemic.

TRASH PICKUP, RECYCLING, AND HAZARD-OUS WASTE DISPOSAL

Large brush pickup

Our neighborhood is scheduled for large brush pickup the week of February 7, 2021. Stack large brush loosely along the curb in one row, not more than 15 feet across and no higher than 4 feet. Tree trunks more than 8 inches in diameter should be cut 3 feet long or less.

Hazardous Waste Pickup

Due to COVID-19, the City of Austin Recycle & Reuse Drop-off Center is closed to the public. Instead, Austin-Travis County residents can schedule contactless pick-up of household hazardous waste from their homes for safe disposal. Hazardous waste includes cleaning products; automotive fluids and oil filters; paint and thinners; fluorescent light bulbs; batteries (both car and household); pesticides and herbicides; mercury; aerosol cans; and pool chemicals.
