Sister Buelah from HOPE (the children call her Mommy) is coming to America the last week of November, staying there until mid-December. Her son is living in the Dallas area, her daughter-in-law due to have their 3rd little girl the first week of December. This will be the first time Buelah has had the opportunity to go there. Please pray for her, as she plans to visit some friends in the Pennsylvania, Oklahoma and Texas areas while she's there. This is not a fund-raising trip, but Brother Russel Baker in Oklahoma City has scheduled one **fund-raising dinner** in OKC on December 3rd (Saturday), 6pm at the Cherokee Hills Baptist Church. There's more land available, as well as a boys home, girls home and guestrooms to construct. The land is not a necessity, but desired. Depending upon how much money is raised, we will pray and move forward as He leads. Our **2016 Christmas project** is underway, some funds having come in, which has enabled us to get some new clothes for our HOPE and Morning Star children. We desire to get a few more clothes for the HOPE children, as well as new clothes for the village children we're ministering to, and all the 107 Manna Program elderly and handicapped who are in the HOPE area. We also would like to bless all the HOPE staff (nearly 25) with small bonuses, plus have Christmas programs for the children's homes, HOPE School, and in the ministry villages. He provided for all this the last 2 years; hoping in Him for 2016 (about \$4,000 more needed).

**SWEATERS & BLANKETS PROJECT:** We had mentioned the need for all of our Manna Program members and some of our HOPE children to have sweaters and blankets, especially as the winter is approaching. One gracious donor met the entire need! We are very grateful, and many of the MP elderly and handicapped are also very appreciative. As a foreigner, I have to get permission to go into the area of India where the Morning Star is located (both anti-Christian forces and Maoist terrorist activities are possible threats), but the Lord has still given me opportunity a couple of times a year to go there. This time was an extra special occasion, as our Brother Kisan (he and his brother Ajit oversee the MS ministry) got married. He wanted both Sister Buelah and I to come, with as many HOPE girls as we could bring. So we took 8 girls with us on the 16 hour train ride, then another 2 hours (at least) by car to reach their place.

The next day after arriving, we were supposed to be at the bride's village church by 11am. In typical Indian fashion, we reached there about 2pm! They kept telling me it was a 3 hour journey, but with a few stops it took 5½ hours. With the very loud music and drums, village dancing, drunks, lack of a sound system in the church (which held about 1/3 of the people whom I'm sure would have liked to come), it was about everything one should expect here. Just kidding, but only slightly.

The next day was another marriage reception at the Morning Star village, the LOUD speakers starting at 5 in the morning (the previous day's festivities didn't end until after midnight). I'm not as young as I used to be, so needless to say, it was a little bit of a TEST, but the Lord strengthened all of us, and we

had a good time celebrating with Kisan, Shiromani and their families. This is the 3rd time HOPE girls have come with me, Kisan bringing MS girls to HOPE twice. It's a GOD-thing how these 2 completely unrelated group of girls have so much tenderness toward each other, even though they can't speak a word to each other because of different languages. One blessed day, all the barriers will be broken down, and we will be able to spend eternity with our precious family in the presence of our GOD!
