

Eagle Rock Day Camp CIT Program Outline - 2023

CIT Phase 1 -

Eligibility

- 1. Must be 14 years old by the CIT's first day of camp.*
- 2. Prior Eagle Rock camp experience is preferred, but not mandatory
- 3. Application Procedures
- 4. Complete and submit CIT Application form.
 - a. Apply for a minimum of 4 weeks. CITs **must apply for entire sessions** (sessions 1 and 2 or sessions 3 and 4).

Program Details

- 1. Placement in camper groups and activity specialty areas on a rotating basis: two weeks assisting general counselors in camper groups, and two weeks learning skills in one or more activity specialty areas of their choice.
- Leadership training including personal reflection through group discussions and individual writing assignments, observing program area staff members and general counselors, and leading and presenting to groups.
- 3. Organizing special camp-wide events with our staff, assisting in special events, and being involved in morning/afternoon assemblies.
- 4. In-service training, camper management techniques, and real world training including interview and resume writing skills.
- 5. Team building with other CITs and recreational activities
- 6. The tuition for CIT 1 \$950 for 4 weeks, \$237.50 for the Mini Session. A deposit of \$100 per week is due upon acceptance, please do not send with your application.

Goals

- 1. Develop leadership skills.
- 2. Develop counseling and teaching skills within the ERDC environment.
- 3. Increase sense of responsibility and service to others.
- 4. Assist Group Counselors with camper supervision.
- 5. Assist Activity Counselors in carrying out lesson plans in an activity.
- 6. Improve interpersonal skills with peers, campers, and staff.



Responsibilities

- 1. Participate and assist campers in all activity areas.
- 2. Report any behavior problems to the Group Counselor in the group.
- 3. Act as a role model to all campers.
- 4. Make their best effort to learn new skills or improve upon old skills while in their chosen activity area.
- 5. Cooperate with all camp personnel to ensure safety for all campers.
- 6. Complete tasks and/or assignments given to them by the CIT Coordinator, whether individually or in a team setting (e.g. keeping a daily camp journal, participating in team building activities, etc).
- 7. Help campers share in the responsibility of care of the grounds by setting a good example.
- 8. Be prompt, neat, and willing to do more than the minimum requirements.
- 9. See that campers keep their belongings in order and out of the Lost and Found.
- 10. Be sure that campers are properly hydrated and protected from the sun.
- 11. Be alert of and report to the office any elements of danger (e.g. broken equipment, loose nails, poison ivy, etc.).
- 12. Carry out any additional tasks set forth by the Group Counselor, Activity Counselor, or CIT Coordinator.

II. CIT Phase 2

Eligibility

- 1. 15 years old by the CIT's first day of camp.* (CITs cannot switch from a CIT 1 to a CIT 2 mid-summer)
- 2. Completed ERDC CIT-1 program.
- 3. Application Procedures
- 4. Complete and submit CIT Application form.
- 5. Apply for a minimum of 4 weeks. CITs **must apply for entire sessions** (sessions 1 and 2 or sessions 3 and 4).
- 1. CIT-2 Program Details
- 2. Placement in camper groups and activity specialty areas on a rotating basis each session: assisting general counselors in camper groups, and learning skills in one or more activity specialty areas of their choice.
- Leadership training including regular observation and evaluation by group Senior Counselor, Activity Counselor, and CIT Coordinator/Director; personal reflection through group discussions and individual writing assignments.
- 4. While supervised, lead one camper group for a day, and lead one activity area for a day.



- 5. Organizing special camp-wide events with our staff, assisting in special events, and being involved in morning/afternoon assemblies.
- 6. In-service training, camper management techniques, and real world training including interview and resume writing skills.
- 7. The tuition for a CIT 2- \$300 per four week session, \$75 for the mini session. A deposit of \$50 per week is due upon acceptance; please do not send with your application.

Goals

- 1. Successfully program and implement a lesson plan for an activity area.
- 2. Lead a group of campers in their daily activities.
- 3. Improve camper management skills.
- 4. Increase preparedness for summer camp counselor position.
- 5. Continue to improve interpersonal skills with peers, campers, and staff.
- 6. Continue to increase leadership, counseling, and teaching skills.

Responsibilities

- 1. While at ERDC, a CIT-2 will continue to follow all CIT-1 responsibilities, as well as:
- 2. Under Group Counselor supervision, curb negative behaviors of campers.
- 3. Assist Activity Counselors in programming and implementing activity lesson plans.
- 4. Lead a group of campers for at least one day, acting as the counselor for the group.
- 5. Lead campers at a program area for at least one day, acting as the Activity Counselor for the area.
- 6. Carry out any additional tasks set forth by the Group Counselor, Activity Counselor, or CIT Coordinator.
- 7. While at ERDC, a CIT-2 will continue to follow all CIT-1 responsibilities, as well as:
 - a. Under Group Counselor supervision, curb negative behaviors of campers.
 - b. Assist Activity Counselors in programming and implementing activity lesson plans.
 - c. Lead a group of campers for at least one day, acting as the counselor for the group.
 - d. Lead campers at a program area for at least one day, acting as the Activity Counselor for the area.
 - e. Carry out any additional tasks set forth by the Group Counselor, Activity Counselor, or CIT Coordinator.



4 Things we think you should know:

- 1. CIT behavior standards are dramatically higher than they are for campers
 - a. There will be no tolerance for misbehavior amongst CIT's
- 2. A CIT must *always* be willing to participate with enthusiasm
- 3. Enthusiasm is part of leadership and is a requirement
- 4. A CIT must *always* come to camp prepared
 - a. Required items: CIT t-shirt, swim suit, backpack, watch, smile
- 5. CIT's are expected to come to camp ready to learn every day
 - a. We'll provide the opportunity and the guidance, you bring the right attitude

* The age deadline will vary year to year as the first day of camp changes. If you have a birthday between June 13th and June 30th you may not be eligible to apply as a CIT-2 or Junior Counselor in future years, or may be required to start later in the summer, depending on the first day of camp.
