

Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary) This modified hall-and-parlor plan features a central brick chimney and an enclosed entrance bay with a continuous shed roof. The shed roof extends to the south to provide a small open porch with a scalloped frieze panel similar to ERI-1708. Like the other company houses in this cluster, windows are built to a reduced scale. Windows have been replaced with 1/1 types. There is a small square attic opening under the south gable. 43. History and Significance Another Norman Kelley and Co. house built for its quarry workers c. 1873, it is perhaps best known for the Milli family that lived here c. 1908-1912. They were of Hungarian origin and established a more permanent life on the island than many other quarry workers. With a growing family to accommodate (9 girls and 1 boy) they later moved to the larger quarry house (ERI-1714)		27. Other Surveys in Which Included N/A
