There are approximately 1,400 miles of trails to be explored, signed and documented. This program's success will ultimately depend on great folks like you to volunteer for upcoming events. Along with our efforts and the AZ4X4 club we are hoping this pilot program will be a great success

There are many fun tasks that you can volunteer for. For example, installing and recording trail signs, clean-up efforts, and clearing overgrown brush. Participation in his program will expand your navigation skills and test your adventurous spirit as you experience the exciting challenges these trails hold.

We currently have 3 Crew Leaders that have attended the 2 free training classes with TRAL. There are many opportunities for anyone who is interested. Please contact Jennifer Blum if would like to sign up. This program has not officially started so there is still lots of time to sign up. The volunteer opportunities will also continue as the program progresses.

Currently, our club has been assigned to 6 trails in an area that is south of Superior. We can begin once the club volunteer agreements with TRAL are signed. In the future, there will be many opportunities for us to camp together and then break up into multiple smaller groups, to complete as many trails as possible in one area. Tow Strap Safety Tip

In follow up to our recent Recovery Clinic and for the safety of our members I'd like your help to design a comprehensive list of supplies that should be brought on runs for the following three categories.

1: Short Run: A few hours with minimal distance covered, and a slim chance for a mechanical break down. If so, home is close by and help is more readily available.

2: Full Day Run and/or Overnighter: A greater distance is covered, possibly an overnighter that could result in a greater chance for a break down and the lack of available parts that are close by.

3: Several Days Run: Lots of miles covered with varied terrains offers a greater possibility of break downs and unavailable parts.

I would like to add this safety information to the CS4W Website and would appreciate your suggestions. If everyone would take a few minutes to compile your lists and email them to Jim Nossett at tradcoach@msn.com I will post the information on the club's website.

I believe this information is very important and would benefit all of us.


You Know You're a Copperstate 4-Wheeler
