Women's Vollball

Women's volleyball had a strong season this year, coming in third in the Ivy League Championships. After helping lead the Princeton women's volleyball



team to a third-place finish in the Ivy League, Tiger Inn's Nicole Kincade (pictured here) and Kendall Peterkin earned 2014 All-Ivy honors. Both Kincade and Peterkin earned first-team distinction.

"I'm so proud of Kendall and Nicole" head coach Sabrina King said. "They all worked very hard this season. Kendall was the heart of our offense throughout the fall. The team was constantly in awe at her ability to shoulder the pressure of being the go-to hitter this season and her ability to consistently perform at an incredibly high level match after match. Nicole has persevered through injuries to finally show the league her amazing talent. I'm so glad she was able to showcase it in her senior year and also step up as a leader." Peterkin was one of three unanimous first-team All-Ivy League selections, and led the Ivy League in both kills (4.55) and points (5.21); both totals ranked in the Top 15 nationally, including a 12th-best mark in points.

Men's Squash

In 2012, Tyler Osborne '15 was the lone freshman to start on Princeton's historic CSA national team victory, which ended Trinity's 13-year title reign. He had one of the biggest victories in Princeton history. He earned All-Ivy League and second-team All-America honors boasting a 14-2 his freshman season. This year Tyler Osborne was named to the 2015 All-Ivy League team. Osborne was 15-1, 7-0 in the Ivy League and helped to win two Ivy League championships (2012, 2013) during his career. He served as a mentor to a solid group of younger players who will lead the team moving forward.
