## Matt York presents The Highwaymen: Songs & Stories\* Thursday, March 27th 6:00-7:00pm







Join other genealogy enthusiasts in the Library's Brian H. Reynolds Local History Room for a discussion and special Zoom presentation: *Tracing Your Immigrant Ancestors* with Margaret R. Fortier. While there are specific strategies for each ethnic group, there is also a systematic process that applies to any search for immigrants. Margaret will guide you through each step of the process with examples. Discover your immigrant ancestors and tell their stories!

Margaret Rose Fortier is a Board-certified genealogical researcher, writer, and lecturer. She specializes in immigrant ancestors to New England. A graduate of Boston College and Bentley University, she holds a Certificate in Genealogical Research from Boston University. She serves on the board of the Association of Professional Genealogists, is co-editor of the National Genealogical Society Quarterly, and is an instructor for the Spring 2025 course, "Tracing Your French-Canadian Ancestors" at the Salt Lake Institute of Genealogy. 

This annual all-student art show is a joint effort featuring mixed media artwork by students who attend Apponequet Regional High School and Old Colony Regional Vocational Technical High School.






