

Summerset City News July 2021

The month of June has been guite a busy month at the city. At the end of May, the city began working with a local developer and the Governor's Office of Economic Development to become a potential site for their expanding company. It was determined that two sites in Summerset were in the top five finalists for this company's expansion. The last week of June, our city administrator, President of the Commission, and other government officials met with the CFO of this company and shared, promoted, and advocated for the city of Summerset to become their future business site. Regardless of whether we are chosen for the future business site, Summerset citizens should be proud of our community, which was confirmed by the comments regarding the beautiful, well cared for homes, friendly people, the business growth potential and projects, and overall positive impression that Summerset made.

This past month, we have worked on a Memorandum of Understanding with a local developer to look at the possibility of changing the original project plan for TIF District #2 to assist with infrastructure costs. The commission unanimously voted to approve the MOU, provided the developer follows the proper protocols and procedures. We have also passed temporary emergency ordinances regarding marijuana use in public places and licensing for a dispensary. We plan to amend and finalize these ordinances when more information is provided by the Department of Health.

Looking forward, I am excited to be exploring more options for residential and commercial development, as well as working to expand our waste water treatment plant. Addressing the expansions of the waste water treatment plant has been my first priority and we will continue to move forward on ensuring the city is ready when more development occurs. We are looking at all possible grants and resources that are available to assist us in this task.

Police Department

§ 96.12 FIREWORKS DISPLAY.

(A) It shall be unlawful for any discharge or cause to be discharged, except as hereinafter permitted, any fireworks.

(B) The use of certain novelty fireworks within the city are permitted and are limited to the following:

(1) Party poppers (not to exceed 0.25 grain);

(2) Snappers (not to exceed 0.02 grain);

(3) Sparklers (not to exceed 3.5 ounces);

(4) Toy caps (not to exceed 0.25 grain); and

(5) Flitter sparklers (not to exceed 0.2 ounces).

(C) Nothing in this chapter shall prohibit a public display and discharge of fireworks, providing such licensed individual, firm, partnership or corporation planning to make a public display and discharge of fireworks, shall first secure a written permit from the city and Chief of the Fire Department upon which jurisdiction falls.

(D) This chapter extends to and shall cover all of the territory within the corporate limits of the city and its one-mile jurisdiction.




