



Celebrate your Golden Jubilee with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Sunday, June 22nd at Good Shepherd Church.



The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children.



Our Gospel today is known as the Transfiguration. Transfiguration means a complete change of appearance into a more beautiful or spiritual state. While Jesus is praying with Peter, James, and John his

face changes in appearance and his clothes become dazzling white. Through the transfiguration Jesus reveals to the three disciples that he is the Son of God. However, the disciples do not yet fully understand what it means. First, they see Jesus dazzling white and speaking to Moses and Elijah. Then they hear God's voice saying, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." This experience inspires them to continue to follow Jesus.

When we grow closer to God and strengthen our relationship to him, our faith and trust in God grows. Spending time in prayer, and talking and listening to God help us to strengthen our relationship with him. When we pray, make time for God, and serve others, we become better at following God's direction for our lives.

Living our Faith: All during Lent strive to pray for others, fast from something you like and be kind and nice to others so you can grow closer to God.
