## Special Guest Speaker:

Kathi Brown, Scottish Terrier Club of America Judges' Education Coordinator, spoke with members about the Scottie breed standard. The presentation began with a question for all participants: "What do I like about the Scottish Terrier?" Kathi requested everyone to write down some adjectives they believe describes the breed and framed the discussion as an answer to the question "What is the standard for our breed and how is it important to the present and future of the breed we love?"

A brief history of the Scotch Terrier purpose was presented with details on how the body structure supports the function they were bred for, and supporting why a standard was considered important. A review of the standards from 1880 to present day were compared with interesting facts noting the changes without modifying the structure that supports the form and function of today's Scottish Terrier.



Following breed history, Kathi did a deep dive into today's standard, highlighting the proper size, symmetry and balance, balanced head, good bite, ears up, and the front. Understanding this structure was reinforced by discussion about how these elements support the Scottish historical use but also what sets the Scottie apart from other breeds. She described the intent of some of the parts of the standard such as 'cobby' and 'moderately short back' and 'balance' that make up the overall presentation when observing a Scottie. Changes in the standard coat colors was discussed with some information about the genetic differences between previous coat colors (grizzle, sandy) that are now simply described as brindle. Emphasis was given how color is not the important part of the coat, but rather that the dense coat of proper wiry texture protects the dog from weather, briars, and vermin. The Scottie gait was described to explain how it differs from other breeds (and is no longer described as 'peculiar' in the standard) as well as how the composition of the dog affects movement.

In summary, Kathi reminded everyone how to s-p-e-l-l:

Sturdy bone w/ Substance Compact & Low Overall Balance & Symmetry Terrier Temperament Intense 'Varmity' Expression Effortless Movement (Reach/Drive)




A question-and-answer period followed where Kathi provided additional details and information based on her years of breeding, judging, and love of Scotties.
