

Moss Phlox

This Native perennial will tolerate much drier conditions than other phlox.

It is a great low growing groundcover for naturalizing and looks especially good draped over a wall.

Spring brings a carpet of flowers ranging from purple to pink to white. This plant is an important nectar source for bees and butterflies, especially the skippers. It is a larval host to 8 species of lepidoptera.

- Hardiness: Zone 3-9
- Size: 3-6"
- Flower: Purple to White in early Spring
- Culture: Prefers Full to Part Sun and Dry to Average, well drained soils. Drought tolerant
- Uses: Ground cover, rock gardens, border, naturalize, showy, semi-evergreen, , erosion, butterflies, birds, pollinators, deer, pollution and drought tolerant
