On Wednesday, September 27 Dorothea Williams, SIGP Membership Chair hosted the Orientation Meeting for new members at the home of Mary Elllen Burke. The following new members attended: Katherine Baetz, Sara Mai Baker, Peggy Hart, Liz Lucas, Carrie Petrocelli, Renee Rodriguez, and Judge Deborah Thomas. Dorothea and Mary Ellen presented a Power Point about Soroptimist International (SI),Soroptimist International of the Americas (SIA), Soroptimist International of the Midwestern Region (SIMWR), and Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe (SIGP). The focus of the evening was to educate our new members about the projects of Soroptimists all over the world.

Soroptimist International was formed in 1921 by a group of 80 women in Oakland, California. The SI website, soroptimistinternational.org, provides information about clubs around the world. It includes the vision, mission, and principles as well as the history of the organization. There are four federations: SI of the Americas, SI of Great Britain and Ireland, SI of Europe, and SI of the South West Pacific. Mariet Verhoef-Cohen is the newly appointed first Dutch SI President, from SI of Zwolle, Netherlands in SI of Europe. Her President's Appeal for the 2017 -2019 biennium will focus on Women, Water and Leadership. Check the website for details about advocacy projects in all the federations in the present as well

as the past. SI Conventions are held every 4 years. The next one is in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in July 2019. The SI staff office is in Cambridge, United Kingdom.

Soroptimist International advocates for human rights and gender equality through education and empowerment. At the heart of Soroptimist International's advocacy is its work across six UN Centers, in which 17 Soroptimist Representatives ensure that the voices of women and girls around the world are included in international decision making. Soroptimist International collaborates with other like-minded organizations on issues of mutual concern, working together towards our common aspirations for

women. The UN Representatives can advocate effectively on behalf of women and girls as a result of evidence provided by every Soroptimist taking direct action at the local level. The current priority area of focus is the Sustainable Development Goals, which the UN set in 2015 as the agenda for the next 15 years, concentrating on Goal 4 -Education, and Goal 5 - Gender Equality, and other areas that relate to women's empowerment. Although women and girls make up half of the population they are consistently discriminated against, and their human rights are often ignored. Soroptimist International is continuously working as a global voice to empower, educate and enable women and girls to ensure the realization of gender equality.

Soroptimist International of the Americas contains about 30,000 members in 20 countries and territories including North, Central, and South America, Japan, and the Philippines. The SIA website, Soroptimist.org, can be assessed by all the public. There is also a special section for members (press Members Only button – top right), which provides information on membership, fund raising, program, and public awareness. One of the key reference sources is Soroptimist 101, an online introduction, which is a pdf available to read or print. Other additional information located on this website includes Best for Women, a biannual magazine and "White Papers", research articles about Soroptimist projects. The Soroptimist Summary is a monthly digital newsletter that is online and each member receives an email with a link to read the current SIA news. The SIA convention is held every other year. In July 2018 it will be in

Yokohama, Japan. The SIA staff office is in Philadelphia, United States.

Soroptimist International of the Midwest Region includes six states: Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Kentucky. Vivian Walczesky is our current governor and member of the SI of Monroe, Michigan club. The Midwest region website (simwr.org) has information about club projects within our region. There is a regional conference every spring. Next year's will be in Lisle, Illinois. We are also proud that Bev Bucur, past SIA board director and SI/Illiana, Illinois (Midwestern Region), has been appointed the Soroptimist International Director of Advocacy.




