CGC $\$ 25$ per dog-Evaluator Darcy Rohats
Canine Good Citizen is part of the AKC Family Dog Program and many dog owners choose CGC as their first step in training their dogs. It also provides a great foundation for getting started in dog sports.. As you work with your dog to teach the CGC skills, you'll discover the many benefits and joys of training. You'll enhance your bond with your dog, and dogs with basic obedience training are a joy to live with—interacting well with other people and dogs and responding well to household routines.

For those of you with herding and working breeds, let them work! A trainer will take your dog into the arena with sheep to evaluate the level of instinct. (No titles).

## AKC Trick Dog-\$20 per dog; - Evaluator Darcy Rohats

Come show off all the things your dog can do and get an AKC title while you're at it. In AKC Trick Dog, there are several levels of titles teams can compete for: novice, intermediate, advanced, and performer. Each level has a specified set of tricks to choose from, and the team must successfully perform 10 tricks to advance to the next level.

## AKC Farm Dog Certification—\$25 per dog per trial —AM Judge TBD/PM Judge Cathy Sumeracki

Your dog responds well to commands at home and in public, but how would he respond in a farm environment? There's an easy way to find out: Sign him up for a Farm Dog Certified test! Open to all breeds of dogs, this test involves your dog performing a series of 12 exercises that are typical for a farm environment such as being in close proximity to livestock (who are always penned to avoid any altercations); jumping and staying on hay/straw bales; walking on unusual terrain; and jumping over logs. There is no herding involved. Instead, the goal is to assess his aptitude as a working farm dog by exhibiting self-control, confidence and trust with you or his handler.
