#### Youth Awards



The Suffolk County Department of Labor paid for four Summer Youth Workers to give a hand at Pronto. Two of these young people were counselors for our campers; the others lent much needed clerical support in our office. We were fortunate to have four of the students work at Pronto, two in the pantry, one in the warehouse, and one in the reception office.
