

Our purpose is to glorify God by worshipping, witnessing, teaching, loving and serving our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Dear Hope Family:

I have been thinking about worship; and our liturgy. *Liturgy* is the order of worship. It's how we order what comes when in our worship gatherings. I hesitate to use the word worship "*service*." Somehow, we get it in our heads that *we* are doing the serving. And it is anything but. In worship, God serves us.

Our Lutheran liturgy – and every church has a liturgy, even if it's six songs, a message, maybe a prayer, one last song and done – our liturgy has a flow to it, it's biblical, and we focus on Jesus. The flow is this:

God gathers us – and in God's presence we confess our sins, and we receive a word of forgiveness in Jesus. Like Isaiah, on seeing God high and lifted up in the temple, we recognize our need for confession and forgiveness. So, we confess and receive absolution.

God speaks to us - through God's Word sung, read, and spoken and the focus is Jesus. After hearing the Word, we confess our faith, using the words of one of the creeds. Kinda like an altar call, don't you think?



God feeds us – at the Lord's table, with Jesus as host. away the sin of the world.

God sends us - with His blessing, to serve Him by loving and serving our neighbours

In between there, we offer some prayers, we give to support the work of the church, we confess one of the creeds, and there's songs and hymns and spiritual songs, and the object is God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We do these things in response to God's grace and mercy to us in Jesus. It's not in order to buy God's favour. It's because of God's favour.

Sometimes we may think God shows up because we have gathered. I was in India 40+ years ago, and there was a temple where folks would have to ring a bell to wake the god up to see what offering was being presented.

It's not that way with the Trinity. In interacting with people, God always acts first. He moves us to pray. He moves us to come to church. He speaks, and things happen. Adam and Eve in the garden, remember how after they had eaten of the tree


The event takes place October 5-8 at Hosanna Church in Lakeville, MN. We look forward to seeing you there!

they should have avoided – what happened? Genesis 3:8 "In the cool of the day" God came walking, saying, "Where are you?" That sets the tone for God's interac-tions with us. God acts first, and we respond. Our liturgy can seem ho-hum and the same all the time. And maybe it is sometimes. But our liturgy teaches us that the focus of worship is not on us and our experiences. No, the focus of worship is on God - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. - and on his calling, searching, gathering, forgiving, speaking, enlightening, feeding, sanctifying, sending, rescuing love for the world. And that's not a bad place to focus.
