Spring Projects

This is the stuff that isn't glamorous, but it is necessary to keep our park a safe and inviting space:

- Students from Trinity Christian School have volunteered to lay
 playground and garden mulch from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Thursday,
 May 2. We could use some extra wheelbarrows, iron rakes, and
 shovels for this event, so if you have any you could lend, please
 call or text Jan at 412-951-4789.
- Laying another five tons of limestone dust on the walking trail.
- Stabilizing/cleaning/painting playground equipment.
- Power-washing/painting the former basketball court (the "peaceful playground").
- Resetting the fence along the left side of the walking trail.

As soon as we have dates for work parties, we'll let you know with signs, email, phone calls, and Facebook.

Getsy Memorial

The late Jim Getsy helped to improve the landscaping at the park for more than 15 years. Because of this and his general devotion to nature and his neighborhood, we would like to establish a permanent memorial to him at the park. We're still in the idea stage and suggestions have included a park bench, a tree, fencing around a corner garden, or a new piece of playground equipment. Please let Jan know any idea you might have and be ready to help us honor our former neighbor.

Tennis Court Project

We're still in the process of planning how to use the grant we have to upgrade the tennis court area. As anyone who has been around that area during a rainstorm knows, that has to begin with a better system for draining the court. We are working with an engineer who is evaluating what changes need to be made to the drainage system before the area can receive a new layer of asphalt and/or sealing. Stay tuned.

CH Park Reminders

- The park is not available to be rented for picnics or parties due
 to limitation on parking, noise, and cleanup. If you do want to use
 the park for a larger group, know that other people will be able
 to use it at the same time. And if your event generates an overflow
 of garbage, please plan ahead and bring garbage bags, so you
 can take it home with you.
- If you see illegal activities such as pot-smoking, under-age drinking, or equipment being damaged, please call 911. It's not wise to confront offenders yourself.

- Do not use fireworks in the park.
- Do not dump garbage or yard waste at the park or over the hillside
- The park is closed after dark, and a chain will be stretched across
 the driveway from dusk to 7 a.m. If you have a special
 circumstance (home remodeling, etc.) and want to leave a vehicle
 locked in the park overnight, let Jan know.

 The storage building has a "This is no longer an outhouse" sign on it and still.... Please use the Porta Potty in the parking lot for nature calls—not garbage hauls.

 Dog walkers, please use the bags in a box at both park entrances to clean up after your pooch. And put the used bags in the garbage can—not back in the box.

If you haven't donated to the park yet in 2024, please consider it. The cost of mulch, limestone, equipment repairs, grass-cutting/leaf-gathering, Porta Potty rental, insurance and taxes is \$7,500. This is the cost of maintaining the park per year and doesn't include the cost of fallen tree removal. Thanks to everyone who uses the park with care and consideration for others.

Are you a member of the Crescent Hills Civic Association? The CHCA is an active community organization involved with updating and maintaining a park and bus shelters, hosting neighborhood activities such as holiday picnics and children's activities, and networking with other civic organizations and the municipal services. CHCA also funds supplies for the Litter Collection and Welcome committees as well as plantings around specific street entrances and bus shelters. In addition, it maintains the sidewalk along Frankstown Rd. between Glenfield Dr. and Spring Grove Rd. Our main source of revenue for these activities is the Crescent Hills residents' annual membership dues and park funding.

The current membership fee is \$15, and, at this point in the year, about one-sixth of the Crescent Hills households are members of the association. We all take advantage of the park, bus shelters, and sidewalk, and enjoy a maintained neighborhood and association activities. Many volunteers help us to operate within a tight budget and keep expenses to a minimum. Please consider becoming actively involved in the Crescent Hills Civic Association and neighborhood volunteer and activity opportunities.

REMEMBERING JIM GETSY



Last month,
Crescent Hills bid
farewell to one of its
most indispensable
pillars, Jim Getsy.
Jim's profound
influence was felt
throughout our
area, where he
played a pivotal
role in founding
and fostering many
of our community
organizations.

When Jim retired from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, he devoted countless hours to beautifying Crescent Hills Park, from landscaping to creating signage, and maintaining the local bus shelters. His dedication to civic duty helped establish the Penn Hills Soccer Association, the Penn Hills Community Development Corporation, and the Penn Hills Shade Tree Commission, among others. He volunteered with the Penn Hills Service Center, was a past president of the Crescent Hills Civic Association and the Penn Hills Rotary and served a term as a Penn Hills Councilman.

Jim was known for his woodworking hobby. He could not walk past discarded wood without imagining a future for it, often dragging the wood home. Birds were his specialty, many of which were given as gifts to friends or donated to charitable causes over the years. Jim was an avid storyteller, crossword solver, player of chess, scrabble, tennis, and never turned down a game of poker. A staunch anti-litter advocate, Jim could often be seen walking the neighborhood with a litter picker. His life reminds us all of the impact that one individual can have on a community and the world at large.

Lee taught English in Ohio before moving to Penn Hills, where she taught at the old junior high and at Linton Middle School. She and George enjoyed traveling and flea marketing. Lee was a member of Crescent Hills Civic Association, volunteering where needed. She was an avid reader and gardener and loved all animals (except snakes and spiders). Until her illness made it impossible, she walked all over the neighborhood and knew every dog and most of their owners.
