FCSA ELR Fun Shoot

These will be held just prior to the FCSA Sanctioned Raton Regionals at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton New Mexico, George Tubb Range.

The ELRFSs are May 22-24 and September 25-27, 2018

The 600/1000 yard match's are May 25-27, Sept 28-30

We will have a one shot Cold Bore Challenge at 1000 yards and 3-4 plates from about 1200 yards out to over 2000 yards. Exact ranges will be given at the time of the match. Self-scoring sheets will be provided, along with a map of the target locations and sizes.

Shooters will have 12-14 minutes to send 5 shots at each target (TBD by number of targets to engage), time starts with the cold bore shot. We will have 2-3 shooting positions to rotate through so setup time will be while another shooter is firing. Teams will have one minute to clear the area for the next shooter. If a team is not present when their allotted slot comes open, they will be moved to the end of the day, or fill the next available time slot.

This is a non-elimination team event intended to give people practice and experience in ELR shooting. Teams will be allowed to monitor the camera feeds, and call the shots from them if they wish. The cameras are set off to the side, so you will have a skewed view of off target impacts, but you will be allowed to know where you are hitting on the

plate to help center your groups. We are doing this for development, learning, and practice. You learn nothing from shots you do not take, or impacts you can't observe.

This event is a work in progress and we are going to be fine tuning it as the situation calls for it. We are not trying to mimic the King Of 2 Miles. The ELRFS is shot on a different ELR range that is being developed on the opposite side of the 1000 yard line.

We will squad participants shooting in the weekend 600/1000, to shoot the ELRFS on Thursday, and back fill from there.

Since this is a fun shoot, any caliber up to and including 50 caliber, shot off a bipod will be allowed. Bench shooting will be allowed using a bipod, no 'rest systems' as the targets span a wide arc and there are strict constraints on time. There is no weight limit or restrictions on bipods, brakes or suppressors. No incendiary or tracer ammo is permitted due to fire risks. Wind flags where possible will be set. A blast mat will be placed at the shooting positions. You must join the FCSA to participate in these events.

We recommend that you have a ballistics program to calculate your windage and drop and that you know how to use it. If you don't have the adjustments range for the drop out to at least 2000 yards and plan to use your reticle for the hold off, make sure you know its gradations at the calibration point. If you are shooting with a spotter, it is a good idea to both use the same system MOA or MRAD and that you work out how correction is called ahead of time. "You were a little left and low of the target" is not all that helpful to the shooter :)

WE WILL BE WORKING ON SETUP PRIOR TO THE MATCH! ANYONE WHO FIRES A SHOT ON THE COURSE, OR FROM THE 1000 YARD LINE BEFORE THE EVENT WILL BE ESCORTED OFF THE PROPERTY!
