# A Very Special Sunday Service December 15

This holiday season, we will be blessed to experience a musical gem from the past with the choir's presentation of the rare and unique Christmas cantata, *The Prince of Peace*. Composed in 1895 by the esteemed composer Emma Louise Ashford, this timeless piece is set to enchant audiences with its rich history and beautiful harmonies.

Despite its historical significance and past acclaim, *The Prince of Peace* has no existing recordings today, making this performance a rare treat for music lovers and history enthusiasts alike. Anneke discovered the music for it tucked away on a back shelf in a closet in the church's choral library. She says, "When I played through the score I couldn't help but be charmed by it," describing it as a "lovely little sacred operetta in a classical European style, but some elements are distinctly American."

E. L. Ashford, a child prodigy who became an internationally known classical composer of the late Romantic era, wrote between 600 and 700 works including hymns, anthems, song cycles, and hundreds of organ pieces. The Prince of Peace was among her early works, written in 1895 at the encouragement of Edmund S. Lorenz, who had recently founded Lorenz Publishing Company (now Lorenz Corporation). Ashford's contributions as an editor, arranger and composer played a key role in the company's success over the next 36 years. This, her first cantata, was evidently popular, as its copyright was renewed in 1923, and it was later published in a version for three parts in 1940.

This cantata has a history at Rinn, though it hasn't been performed here since 1948. When the music was handed out to the choir, several singers discovered printed bulletins inside their folios, left there from the 1948 performance—and it turns out that Helen Anderson, Scott and Shelly's grandmother, was the soprano soloist back then! Scott and Shelly will be doing homage to their grandmother when they sing their own solos this year.

Mark your calendars and be sure to make it to church on Sunday, December 15, 2024, at 9:30 a.m. Don't miss this opportunity to be part of a living history experience and to enjoy the beautiful music of an era gone by!

Beware Email Scammers Targeting Rinn!

#### Dear friends,

No, my email was not hacked yesterday, and no, I did not send out an email asking for gift cards. Unfortunately, the scammers have gotten so good at developing fake emails that they look legitimate. The one that went around yesterday even had my picture attached and the email address included Rinn UMC in it. But I did not send it; it was not my email address; it was a scam. Friends, the only way to stop this is to delete the email without answering it.

When you open an email that looks like it is from me and it says, "I have an urgent/confidential/sensitive matter to discuss with you. Can you give me a call when you have a minute," you should delete it immediately. I will never send you an email about something urgent or confidential or sensitive and then ask you to call me: I would simply call you! So you know from the outset that this is a fake. Also, I will never send an email asking for gift cards! I do occasionally ask for more gift cards when we run low, but the request is made either in church, or via this weekly newsletter, not via a personal email from me, and the gift cards would always be physically delivered to the church, not sent electronically anywhere.

Be aware, this has happened before and it will continue happening. It is not a one-and-done kind of scam. So spread the word about not answering these emails! And if your generous heart just wants to be sure I don't need anything, call the church phone number, or use one of the email addresses printed on the front of the bulletin every day in order to double check, as so many of you did yesterday. Better safe than sorry.

Thanks for being such a caring church and remember to pray for those who feel the need to con others. They are more lost than even they know.


