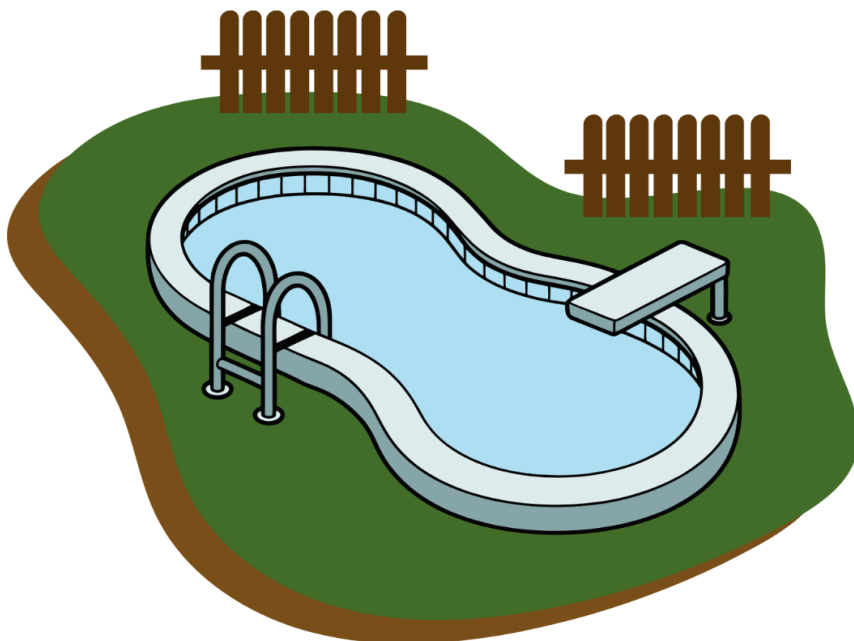
Resident Notices:

Planning on putting up a swimming pool this summer? The village would like to remind everyone of our town ordinance regarding pools:

Section 6 of the Village of Sheridan Zoning Codes regarding Swimming Pools

13.) Outdoor swimming pools with water capacity height 24 inches or greater provided that it is maintained and protected as follows:

- Pool must be entirely fenced with a fence no less than 4 feet in height. The fence shall be of a type not to allow passage of an object greater than four (4) inches in diameter and not easily traversable or climbable by children.
- A side of a building may be used as part of the fenced enclosure so long as the resulting enclosure is entirely closed and protected from access by children. The wall of pool may be considered part of the fence so long as fence material extends above the water level or rim of the pool, no less than 1 foot.
- A safety ring or pole must be located by the pool for rescue purposes.
- The gate allowing access to the pool must be self-latching and equipped with hardware for a locking device to be used when the pool is not in use. In the event of no gate in the vicinity of the pool, it may be protected by a lockable ladder.
- Pool water must be filtered and maintained with clarity such that a black disc twelve (12) inches in diameter placed on the bottom of the pool is clearly visible from the side of the pool.
- A protective cover of sufficient strength and type to protect a child from the water shall be placed over any pool remaining erected over the non-swimming season.
- All outdoor swimming pools shall be constructed in a manner consistent with Article 680 of the 2002 Edition of the National Electrical Code with respect to technical requirements for the design, installation, wiring, and location of the pools and pool components, including, but not limited to, pool filters, motors, and GFCI circuits.



Pool Permit Fees:

Pools, above ground - \$105.00 flat fee plus \$60.00 electrical fee

Pools, in ground - \$150.00 flat fee plus \$60.00 electrical fee

Resident Notices:

Chapter 6 under the Nuisance Per Se section

It shall be declared to be a nuisance to allow garbage, refuse or rubbish to accumulate or to be collected in any place zoned by the Village of Sheridan as being in a residential district unless it is placed within a garbage container subject to pickup by a waste hauler no less frequently than twice a month.

(The Village of Sheridan has scheduled our Spring Clean Up Day on May 9th)

Chapter 18-REMOVAL OF ABANDONED MOTOR VEHICLES

Village Ordinance states a "Junk Vehicle" is defined as a vehicle that is not in running condition, is not currently licensed or currently insured. Village Ordinance can be found on our web-site at www.sheridan-il.us under the Municipal Code of Sheridan.

It is not our desire to enforce this ordinance or cause fines and inconvenience to residents, however to keep Sheridan clean Zoning Enforcement will take place if necessary.

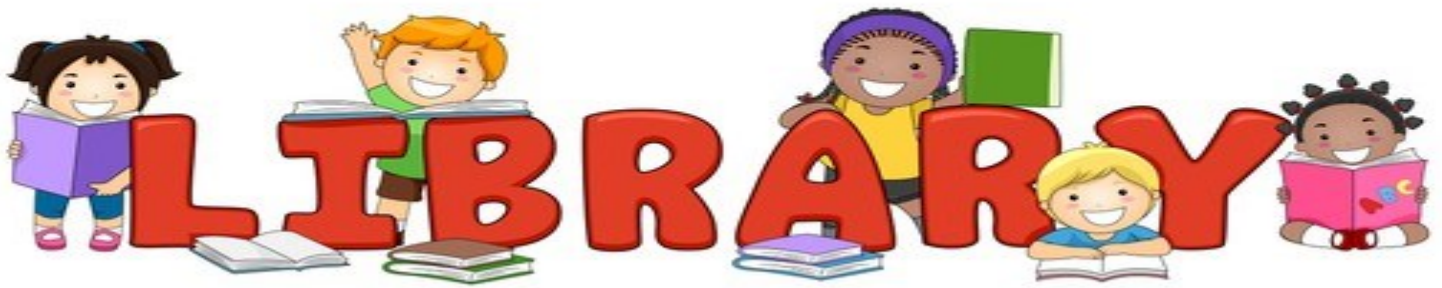

Sheridan Community Fire Protection District Newsletter

March 2025

The Board of Trustees will be working on the new Budget for the upcoming FY 25-26. The new ambulance delivery date will now be April/May of 2026 instead of December 2025. The Ambulance will not even go on the line until September of this year. So, Sheridan should have a new ambulance and new engine delivered in May 2026.

The Department applied for a Building Renovation Grant for \$350,000.00 from the OSFM. If received, this grant will provide funding for a new addition to the station for sleeping quarters, storage and an additional bay on the west side of the current station. Grant paperwork was due on 2/28/25. It is unknown when we will be notified if we will or will not receive the funding.

The Sheridan Fire District received a OSFM Small Equipment Grant for the amount of \$10,747.00. This grant was used to purchase Sledge Hammers, Pick axes, Flat head axes, Halligan tools, Flashlights, Thermal Imaging Camera, Safety Vests and a Rescue Saw. Attached is a picture of everything but the saw and safety vests, as they have not arrived yet.

The Fire District has also applied for the Department of Natural Resource grant for equipment such as hose, nozzles, exhaust fan, blowers, gas meters, co Detector etc.

Please take time and make sure all your CO and Smoke detectors are working properly. Time change usually means changing your batteries in them also unless you have the 10 year detectors.



Thank you too all residents and non residents for the support you have shown the Fire Department. It is greatly appreciated.

Just another reminder, PLEASE make sure your house numbers on posted on your house if you live in the Village limits. There are still quite a few that don't have them.
