## 102<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Rockford, Illinois

The 102nd Annual Business Meeting of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau was held at the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau building, Rockford, Illinois and by Zoom on March 16, 2022. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 pm. by President Julie Newhouse, who led us in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Members Jessica Bubert, Matt Bullard, John Cleland, John Mitchell, Sidney Moate, Julie Newhouse, Trevor Olson, Brent Pollard, Brian Sisson, Kevin Shedd, and Ann Marie Cain, Manager were present on site. Richard and Judy Beuth, Jeremy Franseen, John Reid, and staff: Diane Cleland, Katie Rudy and Holly Wakeley participated via video conference.

The Official Notice of the Annual Meeting was read by Secretary, Brent Pollard. Ann Marie Cain, member of the Credentials Committee, certified that a quorum of the voting members was present in person, participating by video conference or by proxy and that official business could be conducted. Brent Pollard reported that we received one-hundred thirty-six valid proxies naming the President to cast votes on their behalf.

President Julie Newhouse then announced that the minutes of the 101st Annual Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Meeting held on March 18, 2021, were printed in the annual report. As no member requested that the minutes be read aloud, President Newhouse asked for a motion to approve the 101st Annual Meeting Minutes as printed. A motion was made by Trevor Olson, seconded by Brian Sisson, and passed to approve the minutes as printed.

President Julie Newhouse called upon Board Treasurer, Sidney Moate, to give the Financial Report. The Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Activities, as printed in the annual report, were presented as well as the Financial Report for the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Foundation, which was also included in the annual report.

President Julie Newhouse introduced the Nominating Committee: Jessica Bubert, Trevor Olson, Brent Pollard, John Reid, and Brian Sisson. President Julie Newhouse then called on Brent Pollard, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, to report on the actions of the Nominating Committee and the election results.

Brent Pollard reported that Cody Book, Jeremy Franseen, Angela Grotjan, Kevin Shedd and Clay Sohner have been elected by ballot to serve on the Farm Bureau Board of Directors for the ensuing three-year period. The Nominating Committee hereby certified that they are voting members in good standing and duly qualified to serve on the Board of Directors of the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau. A motion was made by Sid Moate, seconded by Brian Sisson, and passed to approve the report and actions of the Credentials Committee. Brent Pollard turned the meeting over to Vice President John Mitchell.

Vice President, John Mitchell then recognized John Cleland and Julie Newhouse for their years of service to the Farm Bureau. John served on the board for 27 years. He served as Secretary for four years and Vice President for 17 years. Julie served on the board for nine years. She served as Secretary for five years and as President for the past two years.

President Julie Newhouse then asked for a motion to give authority for the Board of Directors to appoint voting delegates to the IAA Annual Meeting to be held in December 2022. A motion was made by Trevor Olson, seconded by Brian Sisson, and passed. President Julie Newhouse referred to the President's and Manager's Reports provided in the annual report. President Julie Newhouse asked for a motion to approve the actions of the Board of Directors for the past fiscal year. The motion to approve the Board's actions was made by John Cleland, seconded by Jessica Bubert, and passed.

President Newhouse then asked the members if there was any other business to come before the meeting. As there was no other business, a motion was made by Trevor Olson, seconded by Brian Sisson, and passed to adjourn the business meeting at 7:15 p.m.

## President's Report

The Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau mission statement is recited at the beginning of every meeting. It reads, "Be the voice, resource, and advocate for farm families and agriculture, while promoting stewardship for today and future generations." As an organization, we enacted this statement after going through strategic planning to determine ways to best serve our members and our organization moving forward after our two counties merged our farm bureau operations together.

To be the voice, starts with listening and working to benefit our members. The backbone of the grassroots mission of Illinois Farm Bureau and Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau is our policy book and policy development process. This past year, the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Board of Directors identified a need for a change in the policy concerning livestock marketing. A member brought forth a concern regarding carbon markets and data measurements. Both resolutions were successfully adopted in Illinois Farm Bureau policy and then adopted by the American Farm Bureau Federation this past January. It's amazing to plant the seed of a great idea locally and watch it grow into national policy.

As a resource, our organization is a one stop shop to help our members through our staff, our volunteers, and the information on our website. This year, our members received postcards that provided a QR code or website address to help them make informed decisions before heading to the ballot box on election day. We continue to assist our members by providing information to our local units of government including issues pertaining to property rights and renewable energy projects; information on animals shows and rodeos; and construction of farm buildings in agricultural zoned areas.

The Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau advocates for our members throughout the year. We work very hard to have good relationships with our elected officials and our adopted legislator to inform them about issues affecting farmers and agriculture. Thank you to our members that opened their doors and welcomed legislators out to their farms. It is great to see that six of our state representatives and senators received the "Friend of Agriculture" designation for their voting record with Illinois Farm Bureau.

Every year, our Farm Breakfast showcases our farm families and agriculture. Thank you to the Franseen family for hosting the 2022 Farm Breakfast and all of our volunteers for making this and other Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Foundation events a success.

The promotion of stewardship continues by sharing the story that our farmers have always been great stewards of the land with local media. In addition, we have installed pollinator plots as part of the landscaping around the property and continue to look for different ways to promote the importance of pollinators and environmental work Farm Bureau does every day.

We reach future generations through the Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau Ag in the Classroom program. This year, AITC staff and volunteers reached over 36,000 students. AITC is a great opportunity to share the story of agriculture with future consumers of the food, fiber, and fuel we produce.

### **Local Affairs**

**February:** Boone, Winnebago, and neighboring counties have seen renewed interest from developers of solar energy sites. Energy projects generally require land, and many of our members have, at some point, been engaged in easement negotiations related to pipelines, transmission



lines, solar or wind farms. Easements represent obligations for landowners and tenants that usually last for over 20 years, and they have the potential to dramatically alter the way that affected land can be used. Winnebago-Boone and Stephenson County Farm Bureau cohosted a solar landowners informational meeting for our members.

The Farm Bureau continues to work with county government as they deal with zoning issues in the two counties.

#### **Education & Outreach**



January: To help develop Agvocates for the future, the Farm Bureau contines to invest in our youth by partnerning with the Boone and Winnebago County 4-H. The Farm Bureau sponsored our third <u>public speaking training</u> session for twenty-three 4-Hers. The training invited 4-Her's from Boone and Winnebago Counties to improve their public speaking skills and boost their confidence as a public speaker. Each 4-Her that completed the training and

competed in the Boone or the Winnebago public speaking contest received a gift from the Farm Bureau. A total of twelve 4-Her's from Boone and two 4-Her's from Winnebago completed the training and competed locally.

February: Farm Bureau partnered with Illinois Farm Bureau to host our annual Breakfast before Business for the Belvidere Area Chamber of Commerce. Approximately 60 businessmen and women participated in discussion with the three local agribusiness panelists (shown left to right) Brent Mueller, Claretta Dairy; Tom Eickman, Eickman's Processing Company; and Phillip Raines,



Raines Honey Farm; on the current food supply chain issues. Topics of discussion included labor shortages, modernization of current operations, delays in supply chain for packaging materials and changes in consumer demands.

Farm Bureau hosted an <u>Anhydrous Ammonia Safety Certificaiton training</u> in February for eighteen members. Growers and grower farm operators who transport or apply

anhydrous ammonia, or otherwise maintain anhydrous ammonia equipment, are now required to become certified and must participate in refresher training every three years.

March: Congratulations to Emily (Newcomer) Backeberg and Jessica Bubert for completing the 43rd ALOT program. IFB's Agricultural Leaders of Tomorrow (ALOT) is an agricultural leadership development program designed to give participants a head-start on tackling tomorrow's leadership responsibilities.





August: Farm Bureau went to the Boone and Winnebago County Fairs for family farm fun. Fairgoers experienced where their tacos come from with our "Lettuce Taco Bout It" activity station. Visitors also learned about honeybees, baseball and football. Members enjoyed a nice cool ice cream cone.

October: Winnebago-Boone Farm Bureau partnered with ADM-Seward, Central Grain, Delong (Garden Prairie) and Farm City. Thank to the local elevators' staff for helping us hand out 400 Harvest snack bags to our local farmers and their employees as they worked hard to bring in the harvest. The bags were packed by some of our youth volunteers.



### **Stewardship**

The Farm Bureau expanded our efforts to protect the environment. In the spring of 2021, the Farm Bureau put in a pollinator garden in front of the building. Later that fall, we planted about a half-acre wildflower prairie plot. The first year it looked a little rough. We are excited to see how it will look this year.
