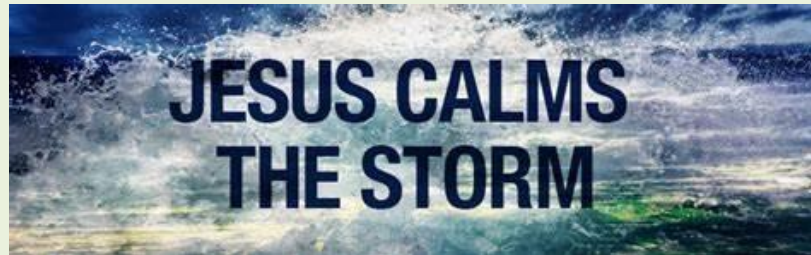

12-1pm: Lunch

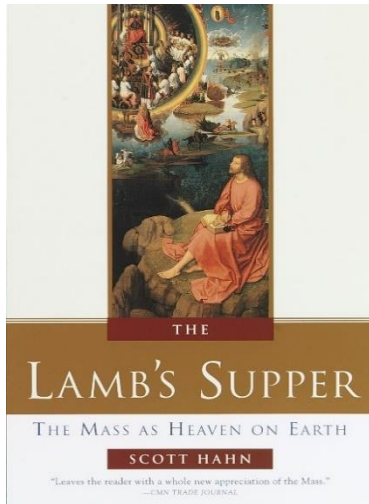
1-1:30pm: Talk 2

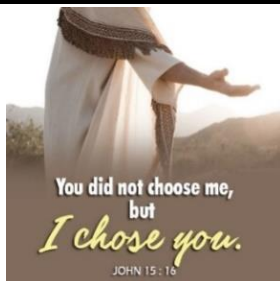
The Lamb's Supper: The Mass as Heaven on Earth by Scott Hahn
