From the Pastor's Study

Dear Friends,

Many of you have had a very difficult 2020. Illness, the death of loved ones, isolation, stress, and unrelenting anxiety have been experienced by so many of our members this year. While it will be refreshing to turn the page on the calendar, many of our problems will remain unresolved. Even as we look forward to saving "good"

riddance!" to 2020, we know that 2021 (at least in the beginning) will also be marked by unprecedented levels of anxiety, depression, loneliness, economic woes, and a gnawing sense of loss and hopelessness. With this in mind, I invite you to hear Peter's words to the Church at the end of his first letter:

"5Likewise, young men, be submissive to those who are older. And all of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another. For "God opposes the proud, but he gives grace to the humble." 6Therefore humble yourselves under God's powerful hand so that he may lift you up at the appointed time. 7Cast all your anxiety on him, because he cares for you. 8Have sound judgment. Be alert. Your adversary, the Devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. 9Resist him by being firm in the faith. You know that the same kinds of sufferings are being laid on your brotherhood all over the world. 10After you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who called you into his eternal glory in Christ Jesus, will himself restore, establish, strengthen, and support you. 11To him be the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen." (Holy Bible: Evangelical Heritage Version (Milwaukee, WI: Northwestern Publishing House, 2019), 1 Pe 5:5–11).

While Peter is writing to Christians who are just beginning to face persecution, his words are applicable to the Christian life at all times, particularly when we are suffering. Over the years, I have listened to hurting people who have tried to "shrug off" their pain by saying "I know that a lot of other people have it worse than me." To which I frequently reply, "that's true (pause), but does knowing this take away your

pain?" While it doesn't ease our pain, it becomes the excuse for denying our suffering. I then remind them that God doesn't give His attention to those who hurt the most severely and ignore the hurts of everybody else. Encouraging them that God wants to hear from them regarding their pain and that it is His desire to walk with them through their trials, I invite them to be honest with God about what they are going through. You see, I am not in a position to take away the pain of the one who suffers, but I am called to nurture their relationship with God - Who can address their suffering.

May God's grace lead you deeper into conversation with Him that you may be comforted. May the love of God for you in Christ Jesus give you peace, even in these cir-

cumstances.



- * Baby food/diapers




All other items, of course, will be gratefully accepted as visits to the food banks are rising, and expected to continue to do so in the coming months.
