## Fox Brush Horse Show Info

- **Horses may arrive** after 10:00 AM on Friday, May 9.
- **Schooling Open:**      Friday 11 AM – 7 PM.  
   Saturday and Sunday 6:00 AM – 7:30 AM
- All riders must have a **SIGNED** entry on file in the show office before riding or schooling in any ring. Entries must have ALL signatures (trainer, adult rider, and parent in the case of a child or junior) and be accompanied by a signed blank check made payable to Fox Brush Farm. Back numbers will not be released without a signed open check
- **Headgear:** All riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved helmets with harness secured, while mounted on the show grounds.
- **Entries close Tuesday, May 6th.** Late entries, if accepted, will be charged a \$25.00 fee.
- **Stall reservations** with a signed, open check, must be received by April 14. No stall refunds will be made after April 21, unless management can sell your stall. You must send a check to Fox Brush Farm in advance of the show to guarantee your stall reservation. Stabling is in permanent stalls. Please do not nail or staple anything to these stalls.
- **Payment and non-negotiable checks:** Payment is permitted by cash and check. A signed open check must be given to the secretary to cover the cost of the horse show expenses. Checks should be made out to "Fox Brush Farm." A non-negotiable check will be charged a collection fee of \$50.00. Entries may be denied based on prior offenses or may be subject to cash only payment
- **Night Watch** will be checking on horses throughout the night You will have a \$10.00 charge on your entry for this service.
- **Medic:** An EMT/MFR will be on duty during show days.
- All classes shall follow the USEF or LEHS rules. LEHS rule books are available from the show secretary. It is also posted on [horseshowing.com](http://horseshowing.com).
- Prizes for first place. Ribbons to sixth place. Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons for LEHS recognized divisions.
- Management reserves the right to divide, cancel or combine classes as entries warrant.
- An order of go will be posted for Medal classes.
- Braiding is optional.
- Per Albion College: Proof of a **Negative Coggins** test and **EIV/EVH (flu/rhino) vaccine** within 6 months of the show is required before your horse may be unloaded.
- *Albion College insists that ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH at all times*
- **ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING** in barn areas.
- Fox Brush Farm, its owner, management, employees and staff, along with Albion College, employees and staff, will not be held responsible for any accidents, damage, or loss to exhibitor, property or livestock.

## **Equitation Classic**

**Class 80 is open to Limit, Adult and Junior/Amateur equitation riders.**

- If you show in the 2'6"-2'9" classes – Limit, Adult or Jr/Am Equitation, you will enter class 80.

**Class 81 is open to Novice, Pony and Low equitation riders.**

- If you show in Novice, Low or Pony Equitation, you will enter class 81.

This is a two-part class:

1. Equitation Class: You will “declare” with the starter before entering the ring. Reminder, if you are entered in more than one Eq class, you must select which class to count before competing. You will get a numbered score that is announced.
2. A written test phase score will be added to your jumping score from your Equitation Class.

**ON SATURDAY** (times to be announced)

You will take the written test that corresponds to your fence height/division. These tests will include both horsemanship and riding.

**ON SATURDAY or SUNDAY**

Before you enter the ring for your selected equitation round, you will tell the starter that you want your score announced and applied to your Equitation Classic. If you ride in two different Eq classes, you must decide which to count PRIOR to competing your class. You may not change your selection after you ride.



## **LEHS RULES**

Rule books are available from the show secretary.

### **EQUITATION DIVISION:**

- A rider may compete in the same division throughout the entire season. That is, if a rider starts out as a Maiden, Novice, or Limit rider, they may show in that division all year no matter how many blue ribbons over fences they win.
- For specific eligibility and class specifications please see the current "Lake Effects Horse Shows Rule Book and Show Schedule."

### **HUNTER DIVISION:**

- For divisions with height or oxer options, the highest height offered will be considered the height of that division and therefore, may affect a rider's equitation status.
- For specific eligibility and class specifications please see the current "Lake Effects Horse Shows Rule Book and Show Schedule."

### **LEHS MEDAL CLASSES**

- Only one rider per horse
- To fill a class, three competitors must **complete** the course
- Upon receiving 2 blue ribbons in a specific medal class, the rider may not compete in that medal until the finals.
- The order of go will be posted one hour prior to the class.

## **Lake Effect Horse Shows Membership**

Membership is not required to compete in any class. However, membership is required for the rider's and the horse's points to count toward year end prizes, including LEHS medal qualification. Membership fee is \$30.00 if paid before the end of the rider's first show. Memberships received after the completion of the rider's first show will be accepted but will be assessed a late fee of an additional \$30.00. Only one membership is needed per rider, regardless of how many horses that rider shows.

Please consider sponsoring one of our LEHS competitive divisions. Your support will help provide year-end prizes to the high point riders and horses, which will be awarded at the year-end presentation ceremony.

Directions to Nancy G Held Equestrian at Albion College GPS 11039 29 Mile Road South\*\*  
Albion, MI 49224

\*\* Be sure to enter "SOUTH" when using map apps/GPS

### **From eastbound I-94:**

- Take Exit 121 (Eaton Avenue/28 Mile Road) and turn right (South).
- Follow Southbound Business I-94 to Michigan Avenue (M-99 East).
- The road takes a Left turn at a Stoplight (Business 94) and curves Right at a flashing yellow light.
- Turn left (East) at Stoplight, onto M-99.
- Go a half mile, just past light. Turn right (South) onto Hannah Street – continue through campus.
- At the end of Hannah Street, turn left (East) on Haven Road.
- Turn right (South) at the first intersection – 29 Mile Road South (flashing traffic light).
- Proceed two tenths of a mile and turn right into the drive for Nancy G. Held Equestrian Center

### **From westbound I-94:**

- Take Exit 124 (M-99) and turn right (south/west).
- Follow M-99 about three miles into town. Turn left (South) onto Hannah Street – continue through campus. At the end of Hannah Street, turn left (East) on Haven Road.
- Turn right (South) at the first intersection – 29 Mile Road South (flashing traffic light).
- Proceed two-tenths of a mile and turn right into the drive for Nancy G. Held Equestrian Center

Follow drive around to the back of the barns and look for stabling signs
