

MCPS Kindergarten Registration is Happening Now!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

Sick Kids: Thankfully the flu season seems to be winding down. However, over the past few weeks many children in our program have been diagnosed with the flu, strep throat, conjunctivitis, and other communicable diseases. If your child is ill, running a fever, throwing up, has pink eye, etc. they may not return to school until they have been symptom free for 24 hours. If your child requires Tylenol or Motrin to keep their fever down to attend school, they MAY NOT be at school until they have been fever free, without medication for 24 hours. If your child will be absent, please notify the school office by phone or email.

Lunch at BHPCNS: Just a reminder that the State of Maryland Department of Education requires us to put out a child's lunch in its entirety. If your child has a cookie or a piece of candy in their lunch bag we are not allowed to tell them to eat their healthy foods first. If you would like your child to eat their "growing" foods first, I'd suggest saving the treat until after school. Reminder: Lunches must be in soft bags. Bento Boxes do not fit in our refrigerators. Thank you.


Monday: The Artist's Corner By Mrs. Mac-n-Cheese

Wednesday: Where in the World is Bradley Bear? By Mrs. Michael




Where in the World is Bradley Bear?



Little Hands Music 2s, 3s, & 4s

Scientist Delfin Reports:

Water... water ... everywhere! This month in science we will learn about water and why it is so important to people, animals and the earth. We will explore the 3 forms of water through hands-on experiments and learn about the water cycle before we head outside to hunt for the different forms of water around our school. We will also investigate which everyday items float and sink in water.

Mrs. Stevens Reports:

This month in Creative Movement, the children will jump, swim, gallop and splash to the song "I Feel Crazy so I Jump in my Soup." They will dance fast, slow, and silly to the "Silly Dance Contest" song. We will continue working on an important skill – crossing the midline. If you were to draw an imaginary line down the middle of your body, starting at your head, that is the midline. Each time you cross that line with either side of your body that is crossing the midline. This skill is needed for reading, writing, and other activities. One factor affecting handwriting is having a strong hand that controls the pencil. We practice crossing the midline when we disco dance during the "Freeze Dance". We, also, cross the midline when doing Wonder Woman Windmill as well as when we use our rainbow streamers and rhythm scarves.

Windy weather songs like this one (check out tracks 2, 3, and 4) will be featured in March in Little

well! ("Here is a Nest" and "Little Swallow" Tracks 11, 12, and 13) Notice the many wind and bird sights and sounds all around this month! Try the songs or poems from the Weather or Not album with your child at home. In music class, we'll be pretending to be swallows in nests and flying to

find food, focusing on "place and space" movement, as well as the concept of smooth "legato"

This month in Spanish we continued to learn about feelings-sentimientos. We sing the song "If you're happy and you know it..." in Spanish and change the feelings to Happy-Feliz, Mad-Enojado, Sad-Triste, Silly-Tonto with coordinating body movements for each; Clap, Stomp, Cry and Shout. The kids get excited every time we sing it!!! As we wrap up Feelings, we begin our next lesson on daily routines; wake up in the morning and get out of bed-me despierto y me levanto de la cama, I put on my shirts and socks-Me pongo la camisa y los calcetines. Toward the end of the month we will start learning the names for all types of animals. We continue to review colors, body parts (we dance the Hokey Pokey in Spanish!), food, numbers, days of the week and the weather monkey.
