Members Reports

PACIFIC DAWN 6-26-11 By William Davis

William and I did another Dawn trip last month. This was our third trip with them this year and our fifth trip of the season, for those who think we don't fish. It was almost the end of the Ventura season for Pat Cavanaugh and his crew. Mike was well healed up from his June 6th hooking incident and they were looking forward to getting down to San Diego after Pat & his family spent a few days in Catalina for some R&R.

At the landing we were disappointed to hear that the Dawn's catch that day was the usual rockfish. We wanted to hear about WSB. We watched as a group from the Gold Coast Lady Anglers Club disembarked. We recognized a couple of them from the Fish for Food benefit we did earlier this year. But the word at the landing was that the Mirage had gotten limits of WSB at Santa Rosa Island that day and Pat said we were headed to that location. Bait tank was full of squid so there were no stops along the way. This trip William and I got the big double bunk, usually shared by Christine & Joel. I've seen them in that bunk so often I am surprised it doesn't have their names on it. It's not as big as it looks, by the way, but we both slept very well this trip. Our goal this trip of course was WSB. I was really feeling good about this trip and was out on the deck very early. I love watching the sunrise on the water.

We were anchored at Santa Rosa and close by was the Mirage and Coral Sea. The first WSB was caught around 6:10 a.m. by former Turner's member Steve Ruffino. Not even the sound of the fish slamming on the deck was enough incentive for some anglers to get out of their bunks as they slowly gathered on deck over the next couple of hours. Pat Knox was the second to hook up. They weren't slamming us like the usual WSB frenzy but came up 1 or 2 at a time with intervals of 15 - 30 minutes. They had hoped to get into a frenzy of fish so they got poor Mike out of his bunk early. I hooked up within a decent time from the side of the boat and landed a WSB with the Captain at my side. I was glad to have a fish to go home with, especially a WSB. Pat said they were on the bottom and to keep fishing. We patiently fished in the same spot until about noon. They kept coming up 1 or 2 at a time. Larry Natsume has his lovely daughter Erin on board and while Larry had a hook up, Erin just didn't seem to get a bite. A couple of big cudas came aboard, and I hooked up again. He dragged me down to the bow and the guys

July 23rd Turner Tak Trip by Ernie Branch

The Island Tak Trip for the 23rd of July turned out to be quite successful. There were 5 spots available for guests which were filled by Ray Bierman and his 2 daughters Collene and Kindra. The other 2 spots were filled by David New and his friend John Gorham, The day started out uneventful as we put in some time soaking our live squid at Anacapa Island along with about 30 other boats. After about 30 minutes Ray hooked what was thought to be either a Bat Ray or a Black Sea Bass. After about 15 minutes of fighting the fish the decision was made to cut the line to give the fish a better chance to survive. Our next move was to head towards Santa Cruz Island. Along the way our captain Steve Kelley had a notion to stop and fish a small cove, it paid off within about 20 minutes or so and the Sea Bass started coming through. First our guest David New brought aboard a nice 30 pound plus Sea Bass and for the next hour and a half the whole boat was bendo. After the bite slowed down we headed off to Santa Cruz Island to fish for Calicos and Barracuda and what ever else might bite the line. The rest of the day was spent bringing in a variety of fish, mostly Calico Bass, Barracuda and a few rock fish. What a great day for fishing. The weather was good and the sportsmanship of the Turner group really shined. Even though the 2 jack pot fish were caught by our guests, everybody was happy for their success. The biggest Calico Bass 1st place was caught by John Gorham and the biggest other fish was caught by Collene Bierman, a 41 lb. white Sea Bass. Collene also caught 2 other Sea Bass to make a total of 3. "Good going Collene" Other anglers to bring aboard the nice size croakers were Chuck Aver, Karl Penson, Jim Clough, Kindra Bierman, Ray Bierman, John Gorham, and of course David New with his big 30 pounder. Our next trip on the Island Tak is August 27th and is all filled up. Best of luck for all who signed up for that one.

kept him off the anchor line and I followed him back to the stern and landed him there. Since I had swept the sides I immediately looked for my husband at the stern and to my surprise we had a double as he was landing his WSB at the same time!

We cruised the kelp and David Nies had something big on his line. This was not a kelp bass but a nice Yellowtail that he landed. His photo is on the Dawn website as I write this. We were inspired to keep fishing. But the jackpot was taken with a 30 pound WSB. Only 1 calico was caught so we went back to our WSB spot for awhile before heading in. With a load of 20 anglers we had 28 WSB, 2 big cudas, 1 calico bass and 1 yellowtail.

Our first WSB dinner from this catch was wonderful of course, prepared by William. I don't know what he did but he tried something I hadn't had before. Maybe he will give us the recipe. Yes, we have a photo but it is being held hostage by Larry Natsume until Sept 10th. This is the first time I have forgotten my camera so Larry helped us out. We should have it by the July meeting.
