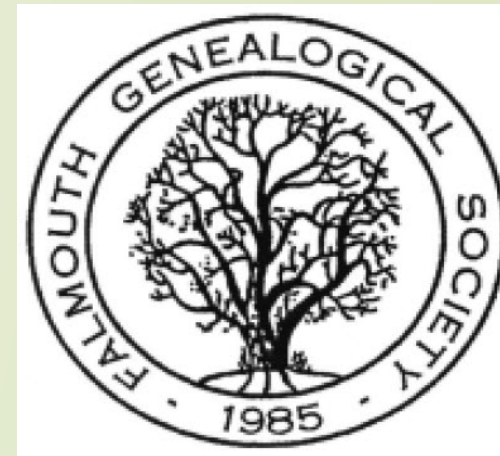

## Family Tree goals for this talk:

- Build a family tree at [Ancestry.com](https://www.ancestry.com) : \$229-\$389/year
  - This is a personal stand-alone tree
  - [Ancestry Library Edition](https://www.ancestry.com/library) does not allow tree building
- Build a family tree at [FamilySearch.org](https://www.familysearch.org) : Free
  - This will likely create connections to the FS “World Tree”
- Examine “World Tree” options and their uses”
  - [FamilySearch.org](https://www.familysearch.org) – free
  - [WikiTree.com](https://www.wikitree.com) – free
  - [Geni.com](https://www.geni.com) – free or paid: [description here](#)

## Some summary points building a family tree:

- Start with yourself (or with proven info) then work back.
- Take care when assessing other trees and information.
- Build out family groups for a broader catch-net.
- Back up your work somehow:
- [Family Tree Maker](#) - [\\$80 at MacKiev](#)
  - Syncs with Ancestry.com and FamilySearch.org
  - Saves media files locally - many print report add-ons
- [Roots Magic 8](#) - \$40
  - Syncs with Ancestry.com and FamilySearch
- [Legacy Family Tree 9](#) – Free to \$35.
  - Does not sync with online trees.
  - Hints from GenealogyBank, FindMyPast, FamilySearch, MyHeritage

- Place son Jerald “Bud” Elliott at the tree base.
  - Find his burial at [FindAGrave.com](https://www.findagrave.com) in Indiana.
- Place Patsy Rumples (1927 IN – 2022 IN) as his mother
- Find Forrest Elliott as her husband married 23 Dec 1943
- Find sources: evaluate and attach them.
- Include siblings, go only 2-3 generations at each site.
- Note the status of 1950 Census indexing for:  
[Family Search](https://www.familysearch.org) and [Ancestry.com](https://www.ancestry.com)
- Note the value of floating/disconnected trees.

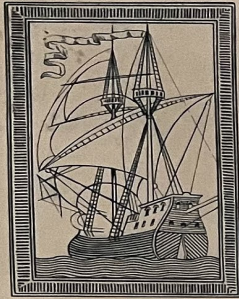
# Joining a Lineage Society



# History of Lineage Societies

Began with military events:

- Society of the Cincinnati – descent from Revolutionary War officers.
- Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company.

After USA Centennial (1876):

- Daughters of the American Revolution
- Sons of the American Revolution
- General Society of Mayflower Descendants

# Societies are large and small

Large: General Society of Mayflower Descendants, DAR, SAR, United Daughters of the Confederacy.

Not so large: Welles Family Association, Luby Family, Luther Family, Descendants of the Founders of Ancient Windsor.  
Associated Daughters of Early American Witches

# Why Join a Lineage Society?

- Bragging rights!
- Access to publications and meetings.
- Ability to meet people with a shared ancestry.
- Pass on membership capability to other family members who share your line of descent.
- Caution: Is membership affordable?

## Minimum documentation needs:

- Each Society has specific requirements.
- Need to check website of each group for their requirements.
- At the minimum you will need government issued vital records (birth, marriage and death) for you, your parents and grandparents.

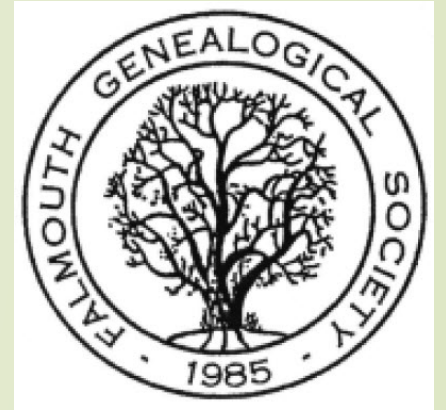


# Hints:

- Caution. You probably need to prove about twelve generations for a Mayflower descent.
- Can you jump to the earliest generations?
  - Are there approved early generation publications?
  - e.g. Mayflower Silver Books
