"Liability" in the Word of God

The title of trustee is not mentioned in the Bible although there are concepts of trusteeship and liability referenced in various areas of Scripture.

"Same-Sex Marriage & the Church" in the Code of Virginia

Code of Virginia § 20-13.2 Marriage Lawful Regardless of Sex, Gender, or Race of Parties

"No person authorized by § <u>20-14</u> to issue a marriage license shall deny the issuance of such license to two parties contemplating a lawful marriage on the basis of the sex, gender, or race of such parties. Such lawful marriages shall be recognized in the Commonwealth regardless of the sex, gender, or race of the parties.

Religious organizations and members of the clergy acting in their religious capacity shall have the right to refuse to perform any marriage."

Schraft v. Leis, 686 P.2d 865 (Kan. 1984) Court Definition & Purpose of "Bylaw"

The bylaws of a corporation are the rules of law for its government. The term "bylaw" may be further defined according to its 35*35 function, which is to prescribe the rights and duties of the members with reference to the internal government of the corporation, the management of its affairs, and the rights and duties existing among the members.

Bylaws are self-imposed rules, resulting from an agreement or contract between the corporation and its members to conduct the corporate business in a particular way. Until repealed, bylaws are the continuing rule for the government of the corporation and its officers.

Richard Hammer's Answer to Including Same-Sex Marriage Statements in Church Bylaws

This definition [Schraft v. Leis, 686 P.2d 865 (Kan. 1984) Court Definition & Purpose of "Bylaw"] suggests that matters not related to the internal governance and administration of a church are more appropriately addressed elsewhere, such as in resolutions or policies.

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:1 Civil Immunity for Officers of Tax-Exempt Organizations

Civil Immunity for Officers, partners, members, managers, trustees and directors of certain tax exempt organizations.

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:1 (A) Civil Immunity for Officers (Without Compensation)

"Directors, partners, members, managers, <u>trustees</u> and officers of <u>organizations exempt</u> <u>from income taxation</u> under § 501(c) or § 528 of the Internal Revenue Code who <u>serve</u> <u>without compensation</u> shall be immune from civil liability for <u>acts taken in their capacities</u> <u>as officers</u>, partners, members, managers, trustees or directors of such organizations."

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:1 (B) Civil Immunity for Officers (With Compensation)

"In any proceeding against a director, partner, member, manager, <u>trustee or officer</u> of an organization exempt from income taxation under § 501(c) or § 528 of the Internal Revenue Code <u>who receives compensation</u>, the <u>damages</u> assessed for <u>acts taken in his capacity as an officer, partner, member, manager, trustee or director</u>...

...and arising out of <u>a single transaction</u>, <u>occurrence</u> or course of conduct <u>shall not exceed</u> <u>the amount of compensation received</u> by the officer, partner, member, manager, trustee or director <u>during the 12 months immediately preceding the act</u> or omission for which liability

was imposed. As used herein <u>'compensation' shall mean payment for services over and</u> <u>above per diem and expenses."</u>

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:3 Immunity for Members of Church, Synagogue, or Religious Body

<u>"No member of any church</u>, synagogue or religious body <u>shall be liable</u> in tort or contract for the actions of any officer, employee, leader, or other member of such church, synagogue, or religious body solely because of his/[her] membership in such church, synagogue or religious body. <u>Nothing in this section shall prevent any person from being</u> <u>held liable for his/[her] own actions.</u>"

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:1 (C) Civil Immunity for Tax Exempt Officers (Willful Misconduct or a Knowing Violation)

The <u>liability of an officer</u>, partner, member, manager, trustee or director <u>shall not be limited</u> as provided in this section <u>if the officer</u>, partner, member, manager, trustee or director <u>engaged in willful misconduct or a knowing violation of the criminal law</u> or if <u>liability derives</u> <u>from the operation of a motor vehicle</u>, or from the violation of a fiduciary obligation imposed during the period of declarant control by § <u>55.1-1943</u>.

Code of Virginia § 8.01-220.1:1 (D) Civil Immunity for Officers

(Willful Misconduct or a Knowing Violation)

"The immunity provided by this section shall survive any termination, cancellation, or other discontinuance of the organization."
