"Labor Day Lessons"

"Beware of the false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruits." Matthew 7:15-16

There is a great thinker who is associated with the labor movement. He was baptized as a Lutheran in Germany and confirmed at age 15. He received a doctorate in philosophy from Jena University. He worked as an editor in France and Belgium but spent the rest of his life in London.

He considered himself to be a poet. His poetry dealt with destruction, suicide, and pacts with the devil. In one poem he wrote, "The hellish vapours rise and fill the brain,/ till I go mad and my heart is utterly changed./ See this sword? The prince of darkness sold it to me./ For me beats the time/ and gives the signs/ evermore boldly I play the dance of death."

This poet/philosopher smoked and drank too much. He seldom bathed or washed. He lived off of a substantial inheritance and never had a regular job. He often borrowed money from family and friends which were never repaid. His mother once wished that her son would accumulate capital instead of just writing about it.

This man did have a wife and children. One daughter died from an opium overdose. Another died as a result of a suicide pact. He had a son by a servant girl. To our knowledge he only met him once and never acknowledged him publicly. This philosopher wrote much about laborers, but he is not known to have ever visited a factory or mine. His servant girl was the closest person to a member of the working class whom he knew. He paid her no wages other than room and board.

Historian Paul Johnson says that there were four aspects of his character: his taste for violence, his appetite for power, his inability to handle money

and, above all, his tendency to exploit those around him. Yet his writings about economics had a tremendous influence upon the world. Karl Marx wrote that history is the story of class warfare. Inevitably the proletariat shall overcome the capitalists. "Religion is the opium of the people." Society should be based upon the principle "From each according to his abilities, to each according to his needs."

The philosophy of Karl Marx has been tried in Russia, the satellite countries of the Soviet Union, China, Vietnam, North Korea, and Cuba. The results have not been very good. Zohran Mamdani, a Shia Muslim and supporter of Palestinian causes, is candidate for mayor of New York City and is likely to win the job. In his 2020 campaign for the New York assembly he posted this on his social media: "Each according to their need, each according to their ability." In his 2021 address to the Democratic Socialists of America conference he urged attendees not to give up on the goal of seizing the means of production. Mamdani has promoted the notion that the city should have its own grocery stores to help New Yorkers. The city should provide free bus rides, free child care, and free gender transitions for minors.

We would do well to learn the lessons of history and notice the bad fruit that comes from the proponents of a faulty theory of economics.


Bethany's 2025 budget was based on receiving offerings averaging \$29,843.66 each month.


