The New Sanctuary - Celebrating 40 years



In 1981, Father Benedict Horvath, O.Praem., the Pastor of St. Stephen's Catholic Church ordered a new pulpit from Master Carver Béla Ferencz. This started the complete renovation of the sanctuary of the church.

The work took five years to complete. The initial piece was unveiled at Corpus Christi in 1985. By the end of 1986 all new pieces had been unveiled and installed for a total of 22 pieces of varying size.

Tabernacle, Main Altar, Sacred Heart Shrine, Blessed Mother Shrine, Pulpit, Lectern, The Credence Table, Celebrant's Chair, Altar Boys Chairs, Assistants Chairs, Flower Stands, Psalm Board, Easter Candle Holder and The Risen Christ.

The Artist - Béla Ferencz

Bela Ferencz is a master woodcarver born in Marosvásárhely, Transylvania, a region known for its centuries-old woodcarving tradition. He honed his skills at the School of Woodcarving and Sculpture in Székelyudvarhely, perfecting his natural talent and strong sense of Hungarian style. After leaving Transylvania, he further developed his craft in Budapest, Hungary, until World War II interrupted his artistic pursuits, calling him to military duty.



During the war, he created "kopjafa," stylized carved spears placed on burial mounds of fallen comrades in Southern Russia. Later, he retreated to the Bavarian woods in Germany, where he worked under a famous old master who enriched his talent. In 1951, Bela emigrated to the United States, where he balanced artistic endeavors with trade work.

Bela Ferencz's work has been exhibited worldwide, including at the Summer Palace of the late King of Romania, the United States Capitol, and the California Museum of Science and Industry. He has received numerous honors, such as the Cross of Knight Commander of Merit for his work "Revelation of St. Brigitta," and silver and gold medals from the Arpad Academy for his piece "Noon Bell," which depicts a historic Hungarian event. His sculpture of Miklós Toldi, a legendary Hungarian folk hero, was a highlight of the 1977 International Woodcarving Exhibition in Toronto, Canada.

Bela Ferencz's art spans monumental reliefs to delicate vases, blending centuries of tradition with his own evolving talent.

Over the next few months, we will share specific details about each piece of this collection to celebrate our beautiful parish.
