




As we were waiting for all the scouts to arrive, we parked in the same area and gathered around near a fire and 2 heaters until everyone had arrived. When we had reached the start time for the event, we unpacked and loaded up with our supplies, like our first aid kit, staves, and improvised stretcher. We then all lined up with the other 37 patrols at the camp and gave the judges their first looks at our front-line workers themed sleds, while they gave us instructions on how to rotate around to all the stations. Moose, Snake, and Flying Eagle all teamed up and walked around together for the day, and we started by heading up to the archery range where we did pretty well. Nic Opelski demonstrated impressive accuracy by sinking all 3 of his shots on target.

We continued to go around doing each of the covid themed stations, consisting of 8-knot, string burning, two-man saw, tomahawk throwing, log hoss, slingshot, orienteering, and even a sled race. At around noon we stopped back to our rest spot and got some delicious lunch of chili and soup before resuming our activities. Rattlesnake ended up placing second overall. I was very happy with our performance and we also had a lot of fun.

In the first two months of 2021 several wolves and bears were spotted at the 78 cabin on more than one occasion. These were not your typical dangerous predators though. These visitors were on the smaller side and less dangerous but were just as fun to watch from a safe distance. They were the Wolves and Bears from my old Pack, Cub Scout Pack 98 from Paoli Presbyterian Church.

In March of 2020, the spread of COVID-19 delivered a bad blow to Boy Scout Troops and Cub



Scout Packs around the country. Like many Scouting programs, COVID-19 forced Pack 98 to temporarily shut down until government approval was given to reopen and their Chartering Organization approved their Covid-19 mitigation procedures. Pack 98's program restarted in October of 2020 but they were only allowed to meet outside on church property. Due to their ages, need for supervision and dislike of bad weather, when the cold winter months arrived in December, Pack 98 was again faced with shutting down

for several months until the warmer spring weather returned. Like a Boy Scout appearing through the fog to help someone cross the street, our Troop 78 came to the rescue and offered our Cabin to Pack 98 for Den meetings. Pack 98 and their Church leadership reviewed Troop 78's Covid-19 procedures and gave Dens' approval to use our cabin and field as an alternate meeting site beginning in January 2021.

Not only has our cabin helped the 98 Cubs continue to meet through the cold winter months but it has opened their young eyes to what fun they can have in a few short years if they transition to Boy Scouts. When the Cubs come to meet at our cabin and see all the awards, pictures, history, canoes, and of course the bus, I have heard many say... "I love it here". Since our Troop has allowed Cub Scouts to meet at the cabin, they have met there at least three times. They have checked off many of the requirements toward their next ranks such as building, exploring nature, and hiking. One lucky Bear found a 5 point deer antler shed on a nature walk behind the cabin. The Bear den has even made grilled cheeses over a fire pit they set up behind our cabin. The Wolf Den has conducted their own version of the Klondike Derby under the lights on the snow covered field. Rumor has it the adult sled lost.

We do not know what the future holds but one thing is for sure, our Troop hopes these Wolves and Bears enjoy their time at our cabin and consider returning to learn more about Boy Scouts when they grow just a little bigger.

CPR Training and Recertification

Tuesday March 2, 2021 and Thursday March 4, 2021

All registered adults who are active with the troop are urged to attend CPR training if they have not been certified within the past 2 years. CPR training and recertification will occur in two parts. Part 1, CPR lecture, will be on Tuesday March 2nd, 2021 immediately after the regular troop committee meeting via Zoom. Part 2, CPR hands-on, will be Thursday March 4th at the cabin starting at 7PM.

Each student will be assigned a 15 min. time slot ahead of time for when they need to be at the cabin. Please wear your mask. Completion of Part 1 and 2 are required for CPR certification. CPR certification is valid for 2 years. We are requesting a \$10 donation from each registered adult who is certified. No prior CPR training is required to attend.

Scrips Gift Card Program

Did you know that you can purchase gift cards through the Scrips gift card program throughout the year? Think beyond holiday gifts and consider purchasing gift cards for monthly expenses such as groceries, gas, household supplies, clothing and restaurants. Every gift card purchased through Scrips sends a rebate back to Troop 78. Half is deposited into your son's "Camping Account" and half is used by the troop for operating expenses. Rebates range from 1%-12% with occasional bonus percentages.

The cost this year is \$420.00 per week if paid in full by March 26th, (\$470 per week after that). A \$50 deposit per week is due by February 19th (please indicate which week you are registering for on the deposit payment form found on the troop website).

Again this year, there is a Multi-Scout Family Discount. Families with more than one scout attending camp with the troop pays the entire fee for Scout one; the entire fee less \$50 for each additional scout each week.

You will receive a free troop T-shirt if you pay in full by March 26th and turn in your completed health/medical form to the troop by May 14th.

The health/medical form is on the troop website, and must be less than one calendar year old for the entire time you are at camp. The BSA has updated the Health/Medical Form this year, so make sure to download the most recent form from the Troop 78 website or from the Camp Horseshoe website. Please make sure the completed health/medical form includes parts A, B & C (part C is a pre-participation physical and requires a physician's signature) with a front and back copy of your medical insurance card.
