Beatriz and Jacqueline, two of the current students, have successfully completed a two-year program in business management at a university in Querétaro. They are now qualified to continue their studies for a bachelor's degree in marketing.



To continue this cycle of success, five new students were recently selected to begin their academic careers. El Puente will pay university tuition and fees and provide room and board at the group's residence in Querétaro. It is not always easy for these kids to adjust to life away from their families and home communities, but they will have the help and encouragement of the staff and fellow students.
